CG Comments

- During C3 Ops update, re: casualty and attack trends [slide below] LTG Odierno said that the trends and analysis are right. What we have to figure out is how to continue. We need to evaluate what we're doing to accomplish our key tasks. To protect the population, for example, there are, possibly, different ways to conduct targeting, conduct fewer independent operations/more combined ops. As this trend continues, how do we adjust? We need to review how we conduct operations. Our key tasks have not changed, but how we do those tasks might change. There is still a threat out there, still people trying to kill us, and still a lot of work to do. Do we do it the way we have been or do we make subtle adjustments? I ask you to make that review.
- During IGFC update, re: cache find near Thar Thar Dam LTG
 Odierno said that was a great Op by 1st IA Div. 1000 mortar rounds, several tubes. Well planned and executed operation.
- During MND-N update LTG Odierno asked for an update on the status of checkpoint construction from Taji to Samarra. Answer: Iron 5 said they would provide the update at the CPOF CDRs Call tomorrow (Tues 1730).
- During MND-B update, re: vignette of LNs helping to recover Shadow UAV – LTG Odierno said, That last vignette speaks to the change I was talking about – it would not have happened 6 months ago, so that's why we have to think this through. Thanks, good update."
- During MND-C update, re: LTG Abud and GOI visit to Hawr Rajab LTG Odierno asked for feedback on the promises made so we can follow up on what was said.
- During MND-CS update LTG Odierno said that he thinks the establishment of JSS # 2 will pay dividends over time.
- Post-BUA comments BG Anderson reviewed taskers: MND-N provide and update on the status of construction of CPs from Taji-Samarra, and MND-C provided feedback on what was said during the Team Abud visit.

27 Oct - 2 Nov 07 Weekly Trends Highlights:

- Total atks continued a downward trend since mid-June. Total atks last week (421) were the lowest since Jan 06.
- Atks against CF last week (267) were the fewest since Apr 05. Since 15 Jun 07, weekly attacks on CF have decreased by 72%.
- HPAs were below the 12-week average for the third week. The nine HPAs accounted for 32% of the total casualties last week, and 50% of the ISF casualties.
- Total casualties decreased for the third week and reached the lowest weekly amount (394) since Jan 06.
- * CF casualties for the month of Oct 07 (325) were the lowest since Feb 04. CF KIA for October (26) were the third fewest monthly total since Jan 04.
- CIV casualties (180) were the lowest weekly total since Jan 06, and were 59% below the 12-week average.
- The number of caches found and cleared in 2007 (5414) is now double the amount found in 2006 (2667).






COIC IED Summary

 IED and AAIED attacks preceding and following Al Sadr's order to JAM to cease attacks on Coalition Forces.



- During the two weeks preceding the 29 AUG announcement, AAIED attacks were occurring at a daily average of 2.5 events per day. Since the announcement, there have been 104 total AAIED attacks for a daily average of 1.6 events per day. There was an increase in activity during the first week of November, much like the first week of October. Found and Cleared rates for this type of IED remain high, continuing October's F/C rate of approximately 40%. There were 7 AAIED attacks since Thursday's BUA, annotated with an additional ring around the Icon. There were two events in Rusafa, two events in Khadamiyah, one event in W. Rashid and two events in vicinity of Diwaniyah. The attacks in MND-CS mark the first in that MND since Sadr's order to cease attacks.
- The second slide depicts all IED attacks in Shia areas, or that are attributed to Shia extremists. During the two weeks prior to the announcement, attacks were occurring at a daily average of 10.3. Since then, IED attacks have occurred at a daily rate of approximately 7.8, with fluctuating weekly highs and lows.



 JAM Special Groups are still actively targeting Coalition Forces within Baghdad using AAIED's. Also, the re-emergence of AAIED attacks in MND-CS may be indicative of active JAM-SG cells in that area.


