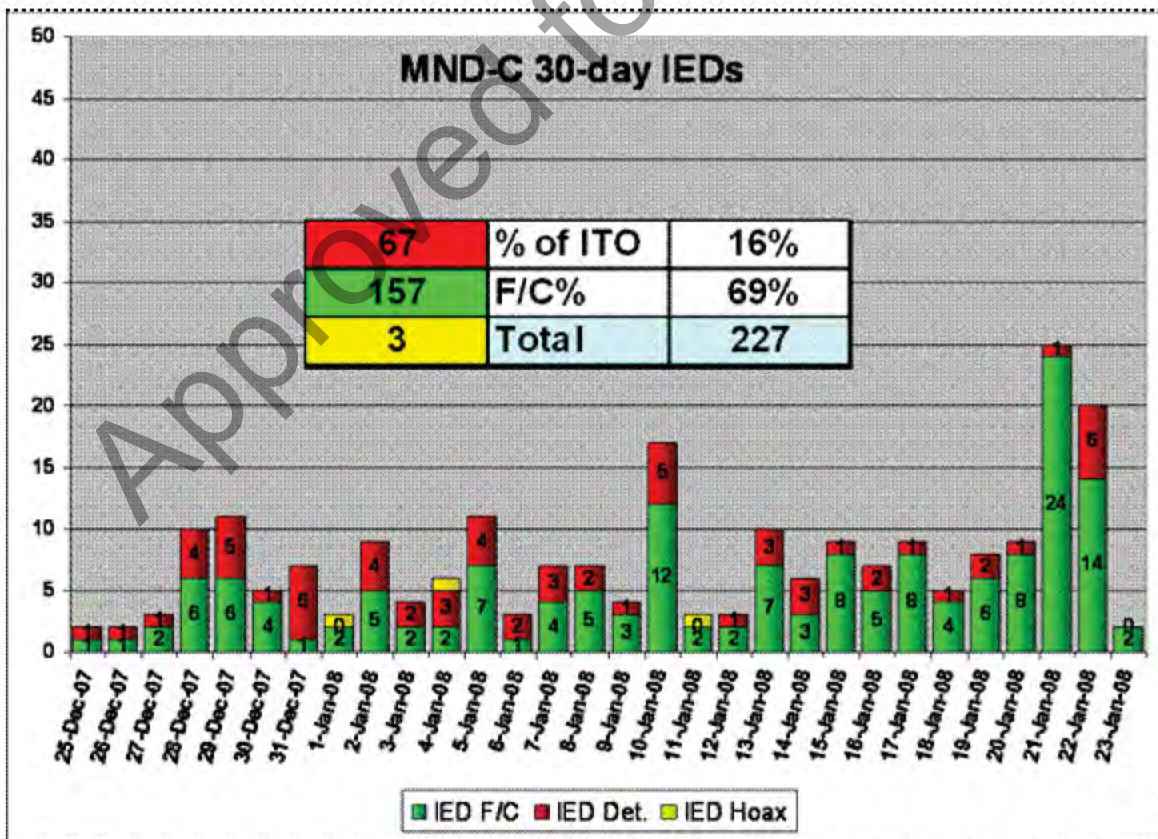
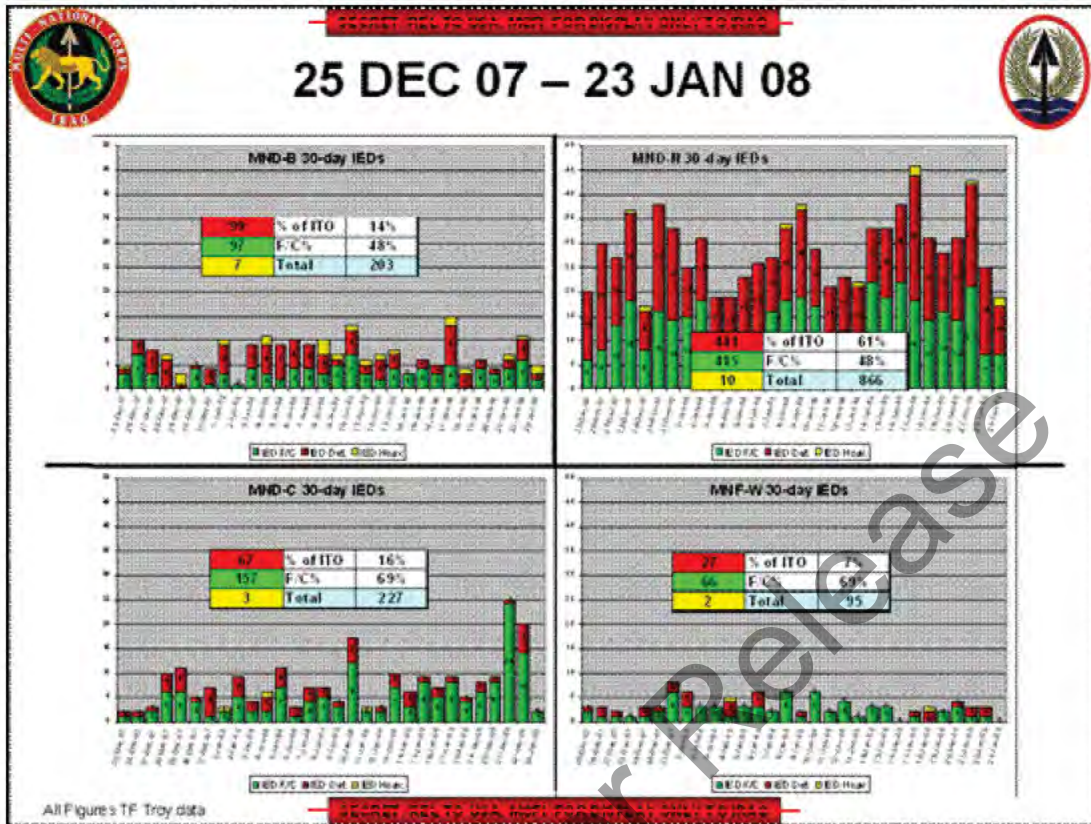
Through 1500 today, there have been 12 IED attacks, with a 33% F/C rate. Directly to the left, you can see the final numbers from yesterday, the 23rd. There were 24 IED attacks, with a 46% F/C rate. Of note, C1 reported 0 CF casualties for the 23rd. In the column labeled January are the totals for the month, through the 23rd. In the Grey column, you can see projected IED totals for January show an increase from December of approximately 60. The F/C rate for this month is well over 50%, and if trends continue, January will end with the highest monthly F/C on record. Projected increases are also apparent in both VBIED and AAIED numbers. SVBIEDs and Underbelly attacks, however, are much lower this month. CF Casualties already exceed last month's totals in KIA, and projected WIA also show an increase from last month.



IED concentrations this past week remain in Mosul, as well as an increase in IEDs in the DRV as operations continue in that area. **Of note is the large amount of IEDs F/C IVO Arab Jabour also attributed to multiple continuing offensive operations in support of Marne Thunderbolt, as well as dedicated Rte Clearance operations.**

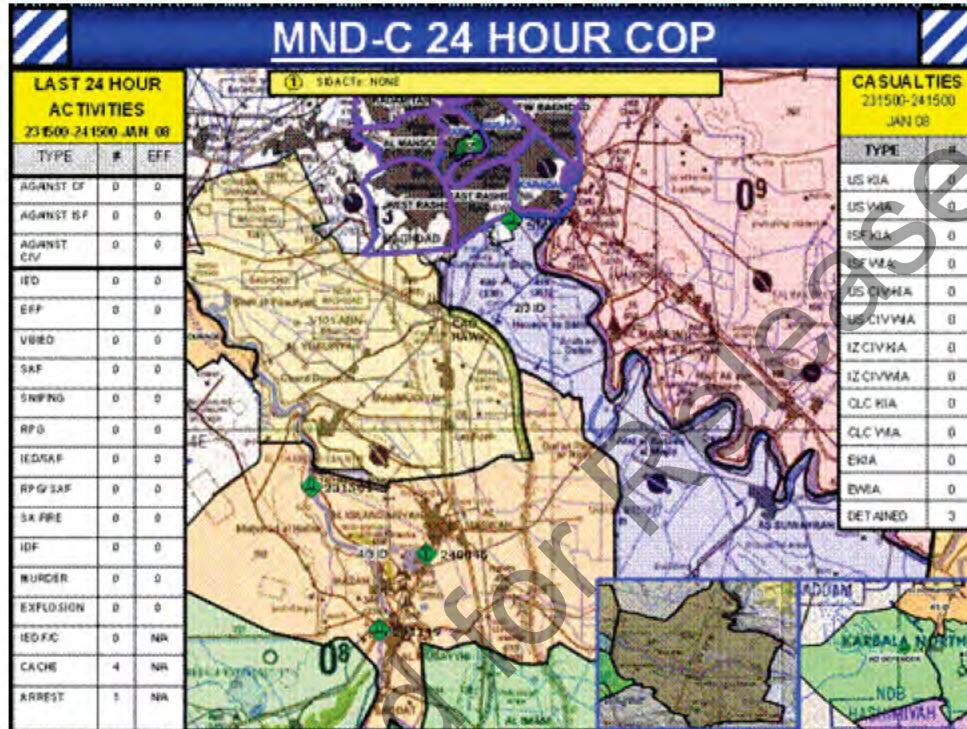


There have been 1388 IEDs the past 30 days, occurring at a rate of appx 46 attacks per day. Since the beginning of January, or the second quarter on this chart, there is a large increase F/C rate that has continued through the month of January.

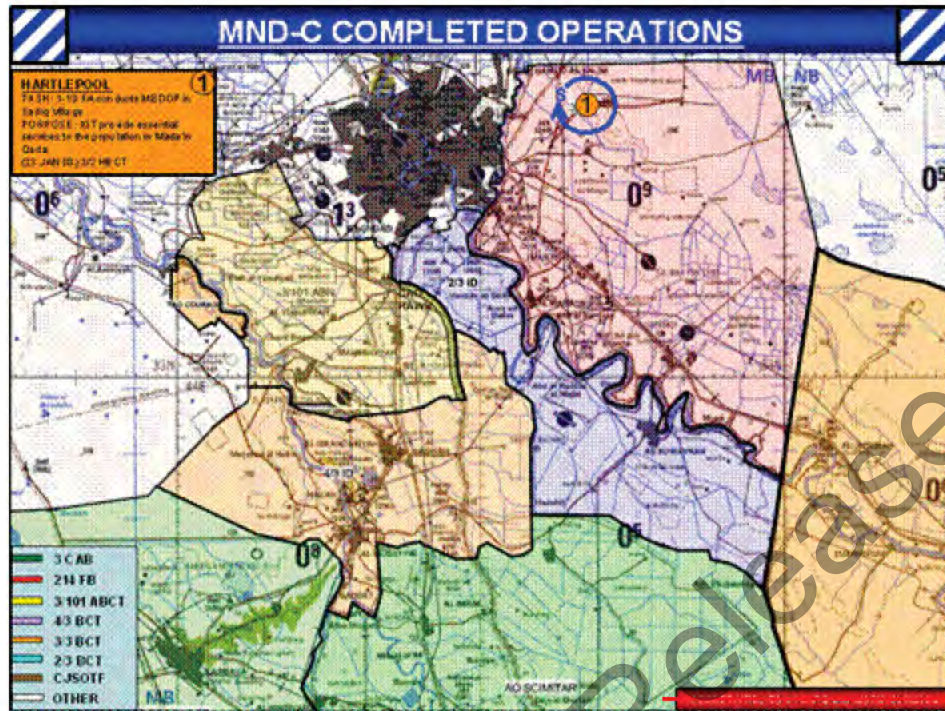


MND Baghdad maintains relatively few attacks, accounting for 14% if the ITO total. MND-N remains at 61%. In MNF-W, you can see continued low attack rates and high F/C percentages. **MND-C** IED activity accounts for 16% of the ITO total, with increased IED attacks recently as previously mentioned. **MND-C** F/C rate matches MNF-W at 69%.

MND-C Marne:

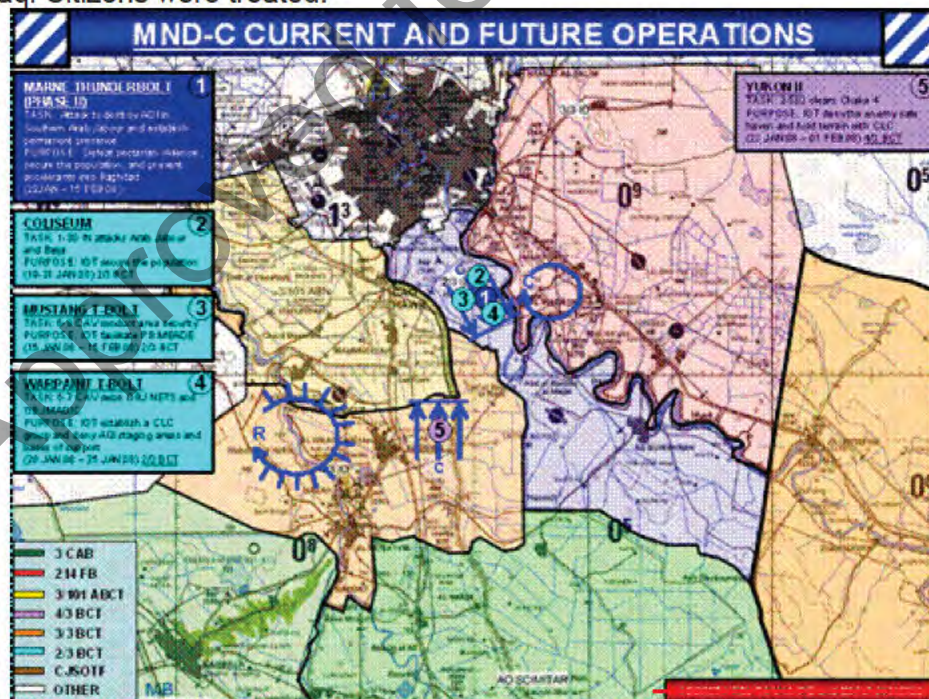


Last 24 hours 5 total events with no reportable SIGACTs. There were no attacks in our area in the reporting period.

Yesterday, 3/3 BCT completed Operation HARTLEPOOL which provided essential services to Internally Displaced Persons from Diyala Province. This operation was requested by the Sabah Nissan Council and included CF, CLCs and local doctors. Over 125 Iraqi Citizens were treated.

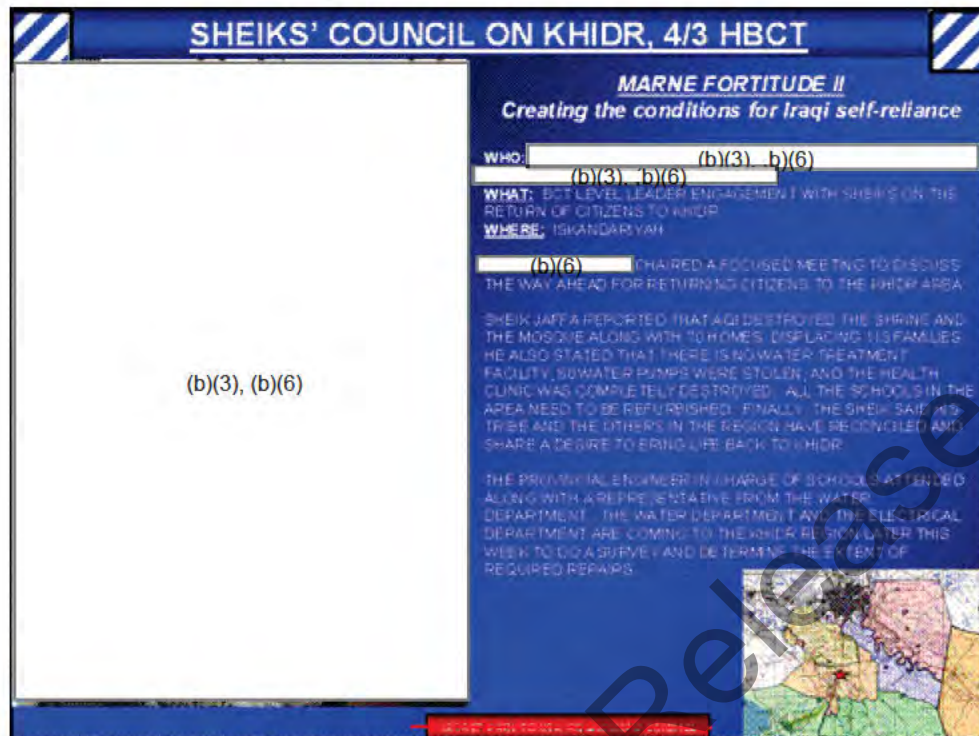


(CURRENT AND FUTURE OPERATIONS)

2/3 HBCT

3/3 BCT participated in the ground breaking ceremony for the Tuwaitha Water Treatment Plant, one of MARNE FORTITUDE 2's designated key infrastructure improvements. This plant is being constructed as a project of the Jisr Diyala Nahia Council in a former AQI stronghold. Once complete, it will provide water in and around the city of Jisr Diyala. This public infrastructure project demonstrates the increasing effectiveness of the Gol as the improved security situation allows progress along other Lines of Operation.



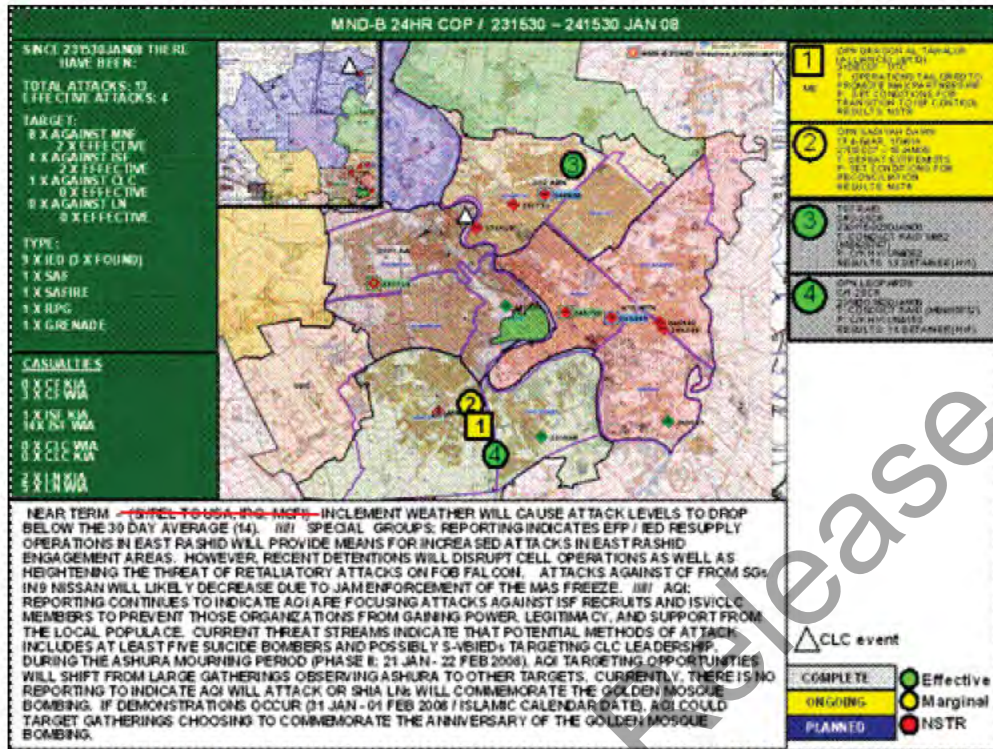
(SHEIKS' COUNCIL ON KHIDR)

As part of Phase IV of MARNE ROUNDUP, 4/3 BCT conducted a BCT level leader's engagement with a council of Khidr area Sheiks and the provincial school superintendent to discuss the way ahead for returning additional families to the area and re-establishing utilities and schools. The Sheiks report they have resolved differences among themselves and are united in their desire to return normal life to the Khidr area. Representatives from the water and electrical departments will be in the region in the next week to determine the extent of required repairs.

ISR AND PLANNING STATUS

Our ISR collection priority remains target development for Operation MARNE THUNDERBOLT in support of PHANTOM PHOENIX.

MND-B Iron Horse:



Attack totals for MND-B are as depicted and are equal to our 30 day average of 13 per day (shifted from 14 to 13 as of 23 JAN 2008).

Today's attacks included

- 9 X IEDs (2 x EFPs DET, 4 x IEDS DET, 3 X IEDs FOUND)
- 1 X SAF (CLC)
- 1 X SAFIRE (HMG)
- 1 X RPG (CLC)
- 1 X GRENADE

There are three reports to mention tonight:

(EVENT 24 0838 // EFP // ADAMIYAH //)

This morning while on a mounted patrol, a Stryker from veh from 2/82ABN was attacked with an EFP in Adamiyah.

- Slug of the EFP penetrated the vehicle's hull
- 2 X US WIA (concussions), and
- 1 X LN KIA during the blast, LN was in his car approx 25m short of the IED when it detonated
- This EFP was less than 100m away from a previous EFP attack occurring on 10 JAN 08.
- It is assessed to be the same Special Group element conducting the attacks and could be in retaliation for the recent SG detentions in this area, which I will address later.

Additionally, Special Groups continued to target route clearance elements in historic EFP engagement areas (route Buzz and route Pluto's)

(EVENT 24 0940 & EVENT 24 1045 IED / ROUTE CLEARANCE TEAM // RUSAF)

This morning Special Groups in Rusafa attacked the same route clearance team in two separate attacks.

- Attacks damaged a Buffalo and a Husky

- The IED on Rt. Buzz caused 1x US WIA (concussion) and 1 LN X WIA (NSI, shrapnel wound to arm).
- EOD post blast analysis could not determine the type of IED used in either of these attacks.

Also this morning, a mounted patrol was attacked by an EFP along route Pluto just south of the initial attack on the Buffalo.

- EOD post blast analysis determined the EFP was poorly aimed, and the penetrator and blast was directed at the ground.
- There were no injuries or damage in this attack.

This is the 5th found or detonated EFP that was a result of route clearance in Patriots OE in January 08. Additionally, it's the second EFP detonated with a low trajectory in this OE in two weeks, and suggests an inexperienced EFP cell is conducting these attacks. Special Groups cells in this OE are determined to maintain their freedom of maneuver along route Pluto and continue to use the vehicles of route clearance teams as HVTs.

The only change to our near term assessment today is that recent SG detentions, specifically those captured during Operation Leopards in the Rashids, will likely draw an IDF retaliatory attack against FOB Falcon or VBC in the next 24 – 48 hours. We have adjusted our Vigilant Guard status accordingly.

In the last 24 Hours, MND-B conducted 4x company sized operations. Of note:

Yesterday afternoon, 2/82ABN conducted a TST raid in Adhamiyah that resulted in the detention of Tumah Hiyal Lafta Al-Mayahi (b)(6). Tumah is a Special Groups cell leader in Abu T'shir (Hadar, East Rashid). His cell is responsible for IED, IDF, and DF attacks against coalition forces. He is responsible for the rocket attack against FOB Falcon on 08 Nov 07 and multiple IED/EFP attacks along Yohamama Road (East Rashid). The detention of Tumah in the Shaab/Ur area could provide significant insight into the possible cross-coordination by SG elements in Adhamiyah and Karkh.

In a related action, 4/11D conducted a TST raid in East Rashid that resulted in the capture of Mohammad Kazim (b)(6) Abu Muntather), also a leader of Special Groups in Abu T'shir (Hadar) and is responsible for giving the orders to attack coalition forces, kidnap and displace local Sunni Muslims, and torture/kill local Sunni Muslims.

We assess that these two detentions may temporarily disrupt C2 in East Rashid and that retaliatory attacks may occur against CF and ISF, as demonstrated by the IED attack this morning in Adhamiyah.

2/25ID will conduct a clearing operations north of Taji to capture AQI and locate caches in that area.

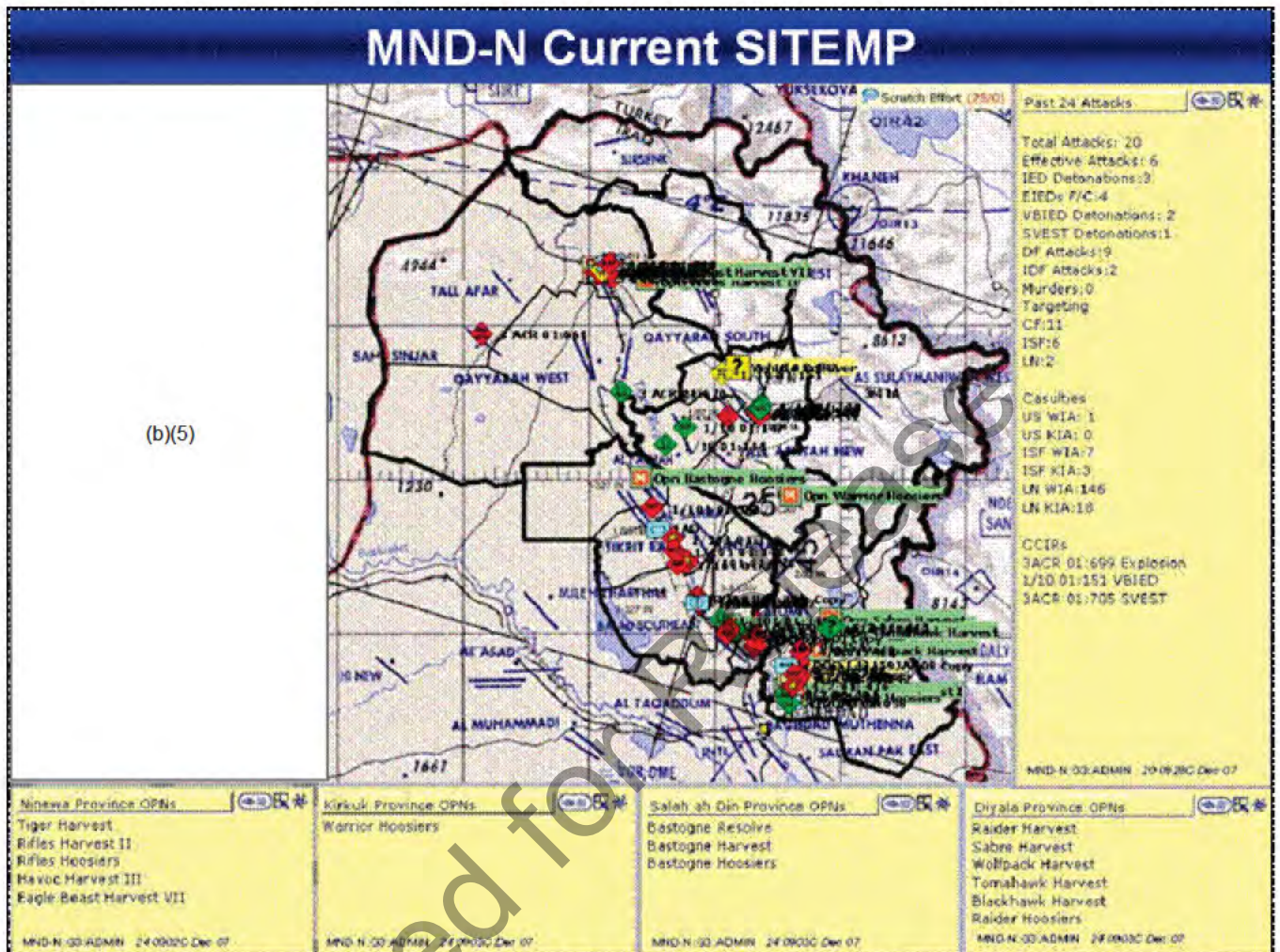

On 22 Jan 08, 265 CLC members reported for training at the Mansour District Police Headquarters. 224 are attending the two week IP academy at Camp Fiji, while the 41 seniors (officers, warrants, and sergeants major) are attending training at the Karkh Directorate Headquarters IP Academy.

These men have been providing security for the neighborhoods of Ameriya, Khadra, Adl, and Jamia as CLCs and now will become legitimate Iraqi Police.

The recruits were highly motivated and extremely excited to begin their careers as IPs. Upon graduation, they will work under the command of BG Rahim, Mansour District Police Commander.

MND-N Iron Soldiers:



During the past 24 hrs we faced 20 attacks and 3 CCIRs. I will cover both of these CCIRs in detail under their respective Provinces in the brief.

Operations ISO Iron Harvest continues today with 15 company combined level or higher operations across our AOR. Sir, tonight I would like to update you on our combined efforts and current situations in Mosul.

Ninewa 3ACR

Yesterday afternoon around 1630 IA conducted an 1.4c raid of a suspected cache in the Zanjah neighborhood located in western Mosul. An estimated 20,000 lbs of TNT detonated while the IA attempted to reduce the cache on the scene. The explosion destroyed and damaged an equivalent of an entire city block, shown here is a before and after satellite imagery of the blast site.

The current running BDA for this incident is 12 x LN KIA, and 132 x LN WIA (does not include SVEST). As of this morning, all medical evacuations were completed. We expect the numbers will rise as our combined efforts uncover additional casualties under the rubble and debris.

MG Riyadh, 1/4/2 IA and IPs immediately took charge of the blast area with security, limited Iraqi engineer assets, and emergency responders. MG Riyadh has already made a statements to the Arab Press, we do not know what was said at this time, DIV PAO ICW Ninewa PRT are working the issue. The NOC is in charge of all security operations for the event. Approximately 2,000 Iraqis are on site helping in and around the blast site.

3/3 ACR conducted an initial on site survey this morning to assess requirements for additional resources and to provide security for EOD conducting PBA.

At 0945 this morning, an SVEST detonated approximately a block NE of the blast area targeting Gen. Salah (PDOP) and his PSD. The SVEST blast resulted in 1x CF WIA(Schrapnel to face and hearing loss), 1 x IA KIA, 1 x IA WIA, 2 x IP KIA (Gen Salah DOW). The ISF Cdr in the vicinity reports the SVEST was wearing an IP uniform. As a result R6 has pulled all CF (3/3 ACR and EOD) off the blast area until additional security measures are taken and improved by the ISF on the ground. PBA will resume as security conditions improve.

We project Gen Salah's death will generate some friction between the NOC Cdr and the Provincial Governor in replacing a new PDOP. Traditionally, the Provincial Governor designates the new PDOP, but we feel the choice should be made by MG Riyadh. I6, I9, R6 met with the PGOV, DPGOV, and the NOC Cdr to first; discuss all support options for the blast site, and secondly; discuss any political complications stemming from the incident and the death of the PDOP. I6 will update you on the talking points in Saturday's BUA.

- 3ACR provided 10 medics last night at the site, today they delivered 2 PLS pallets of Medical Aid/ Medicine and 6 medics at the Mosul Hospital.
- 1 x Cadaver dog from BIAP is on site to help with recovery operations (Cadaver Dogs are rare in Iraq)
- Fixed Wing ISR coverage over Mosul: ARMS f/ 240430 to 240800 and Highlighter f/ 240800 to 241600 today.
- Combat Camera along with print and broadcast PAO from 3ACR on site at 0700 this morning.
 - Press Release from PAO has been translated and sent to 5 Arab Media outlets.
 - Articles have been posted on AL Jazeera and Voices of Iraq for OSINT.
- Humanitarian Aide Packets are stocked in Q-West
 - 1,000 Kosher MREs are available for delivery upon request
- 77th EN Co out of Marez is prepared to provide excavation support upon request
 - 2 x D7 Dozers, 6 x 916s, 5 x 2.5 CYD loaders, 2 x Hyexs, 2 x 20T dump trucks, 5 x 5T dump trucks, and 2 x M984 HMMT Wreckers
- Medical Aide and Treatment assets are on call at Marez CSH
 - Currently no patients at the CSH
 - No CL VIII requested

G2 Assessment

The actual method of initiation is unknown at this time. There is not enough intelligence at this time to assess whether this was an initiated attack or a sympathetic detonation following the attempted reduction of the IED. Initial site exploitation indicates the cache had between 20,000-30,000 lbs of explosives. If this house was detonated as an HBIED, it is likely there would have been more casualties among the IA patrol. However, we do not know the location of the patrol during the search. There remains a possibility that this was an intended ambush and was command detonated during this time. The impact of this event can be exploited by AQI and ISI to demonstrate relevance and capability to conduct high-profile attacks. However, this is counter to the recent reflections of infighting and lack of coordinated leadership in Mosul. The suicide vest attack on the morning of 24 January at the blast site is most likely a target of opportunity by a local cell to take advantage of the presence of a large crowd and public officials. The Ninewa PDoP died of injuries from this attack. The local citizens will look towards the GOI and CF to provide safety and security in the wake of this event, and further site exploitation will help investigators determine whether this was an intended attack or an unfortunate accident.

Raider continues to maintain CF/ISF and improve COP Barracuda in Western Mosul (Havoc Harvest). Additionally 1-8 has begun deliberate route clearance and route repair on ASR Santa Fe to facilitate FOM in eastern Mosul (Eagle Beast Harvest VII).

Kirkuk 1/10 MTN

Of note, in another MASCAL incident, Dibbis and Sagaron IPS responded to a VBIED attack near a market in Dibbis NW of Kirkuk. The blast resulted in 6 x LN KIA and 13 x LN WIA. Damage to 5 LN vehicles as well as local shops were also inflicted by the explosion. [REDACTED] (b)(6) was taken to the hospital but was not seriously injured. We assess this attack was intended to be a show of force against CFs and the CLC, in order to intimidate the public, cause mass casualties, and show the public that the CLC effort will not proceed unchallenged

MND-CS White Eagle:

The overall situation in the MND-CS AOR remains STABLE. There were no attacks against CF or ISF in the past 24 hours.

Atmospheric reporting again shows incremental improvements in both the security situation and the perception of ISF (especially the IA), and the perception towards CFs. Even though public opinion suggests a greater degree of effectiveness among the IPs, still emphasized in atmospheric reporting is the corruption in the IPs. It is widely known that the IPs arrest people for personal reasons, and/or to elicit bribes; degrading the public's confidence levels in the local IPs. It is also widely acknowledged that people fear the withdrawal of the 2/1/7 IA Bn currently in the city. Some LNs seem to believe that the withdrawal of that Bn will result in a return to militant activity and an increase in crime. Sir, we will continue to monitor this developing situation, and keep your staff informed of the latest developments.

For the last 24hrs the Polish RIP TOA continues while maintaining operational capabilities throughout the city of Diwo. Division main effort remains Opn Lions Pounce as operational presence patrols continue on a 24 hrs basis. The Polish TF conducted 9 patrols while establishing checkpoints and monitoring critical points for likely avenue of approaches where weapons smuggling activities might occur. ISFs presence at their checkpoints and patrol based in the city remains at levels established during the early days of Opn Lions Pounce, with one C/S operation conducted today, with nothing to report at this time. ISR focus remains throughout the province, with special emphasis on Diwo.

The distribution of fertilizers continues in the Qadisiyah Ag Union. Of 15 subdistricts, 10 have been completed, supplying over 8,900 tons of fertilizers to over 9,524 local farmers. So far this week, teamed up with the 8th Div, 2 subdistricts, Markaz and Ash Shamiyah were completed by distributing 467 tons to 524 farmers. We continue to work with the sub-district Sheiks in an effort to not only support the Ag development in the rural communities, but also to use their eyes and ears pertaining to militant activities throughout the province.

MND-CS G7 ISF continues to support the ISWAT training ran by the ODA; currently there are 90 IPs enrolled. Weapons, training ammo, and other items still have not been received IOT keep to the training curriculum. The police technical training has been coordinated with the local CPATT assigned here at Camp Echo. Biometrics has slowed down this past week, the numbers are still around 3,500 enrolled comprising of 40% of the authorized IP strength. We continue to engage with Gen Safa IOT place additional emphasis on this requirement. As reported last week 3,100 IP Graduated from IP Academy. MND CS has learned the PDoP intends to establish an ESU unit of 175 IPs in each of the five Qadisiyah Police Districts. The establishment of these ERU units will generate IP contruction projects. We will monitor this and advise Gen Safa to work his requirements thru the MOI, prior to defaulting to CFs support. Concurrently, our G7 ISF cell has advised your staff and MNSCTI of Gen Safa's upcoming ERU plan. Sir, on the slide you can see the past 7 days activity level of the MP platoon. They continue to work with the local IPs, conducting leadership assessments, noting equipment shortages while assessing their overall operational effectiveness. During the MPs assessments of the district and local IP stations along with the Provincial Police HQs and the MCU, of a total of 39 activities, we have good assessments on 19 entities, with the trendline indicating adequate personnel levels, minimal operational capabilities; and shortage of equipment.

MND-SE Waterloo:

There have been 3 significant incidents over the reporting period.

INCIDENTS]

IED - At 0932hrs today CAMP BUCCA reported that an IPS Check Point at on Route MAUI had report a SUSIED at the Check Point. Before a US C/S could get to the location of the SUSIED the device functioned. There were no MNF casualties or damage to report.

IED - At 1047hrs a HART SECURITY PSC convoy travelling North on Route TAMPA reported an explosion at, with 1 x T1 LN casualty, and requested CASEVAC. At 1158hrs the casualty was transferred to the COB Hospital by the IRT ac. There were no MNF casualties or damage to report.

This is the second time we have seen a phased attack on the COB in 2 weeks. The attack was a coordinated simultaneous twin POO incident which, with assessed scarcity of IDF teams clearly points towards an organised attack. We are developing further CONOPS to counteract this threat.

Multiple Phase IDF Attack.]

Yesterday evening between 1837 and 2002hrs the COB was subjected to a prolonged 4 x phase 9 x round (107mm) IDF attack, with 7 impacting within the COB. MAMBA predicted 4 POOs (3 from similar locations). At 1840hrs ISF LO was informed of a POO. GUNS fired a total of 9 HE at the two POOs. At 1945hrs BDA confirmed 2 x Rocket Rails at Black 34. At 2005hrs Fast Air was on task. At 2009hrs GUNS fired a further 2 x HE against a POO. There were no MNF casualties and some minor HESCO damage to report at Camp COPENHAGEN.

4 J7 (ISF) IA SP TRAINING]

Anti Ambush Training (A2T):

Following the high number of attempts on Gen Jallil's life over recent months, MND(SE) identified the need for close protection and anti-ambush training for key members of the ISF. After consultation with Gen Jalil, 10 selected Emergency Bn (TSU) personnel underwent a 2-week package of Anti-ambush Trg at DTC SHAIBAH to enhance their body guarding skills when protecting senior IPS commanders.

The students can be seen practicing escorting a Principal, consolidating theoretical training by the practical application of their new skills. Throughout the intensive course, the students have been very receptive, demonstrating a positive attitude to training, a further indication of both the IPS desire to develop and stimulate future mutual cooperation with MNF.

Further development of the M2T concept should result in delivery of a course for future IPS students being managed by IPS and MNF Instructors. There is scope for this type of training to be rolled out to other ISF units.

Cin C LAND's Visit

CinC Land visited the British Forces based at the COB yesterday.

A REVIEW OF EVENTS AND TRENDS OVER THE PAST 24 HOURS SHOWS THERE WERE A TOTAL OF 6 REPORTED EVENTS ON MSRS, ASRS AND LOGBASES, A DECREASE OF 16 FROM THE PREVIOUS REPORT. OF THE 6 ATTACKS, 17% (1) WERE ON 316th ESC UNITS.

IN SUPPORT OF OPERATIONS, THE 316TH IS COORDINATING WITH **MND-C** TO FACILITATE THE MOVEMENT OF THE 13TH **GEORGIAN INFANTRY BATTALION FROM FOB DELTA TO COP CLEARY**. THE 7th SB IS PREPARED TO PROVIDE SUPPLEMENTAL TRANSPORTATION SUPPORT, AND WE WILL ADJUST SUPPORT REQUIREMENTS AS NECESSARY TO ACCOUNT FOR THIS SHIFT IN FORCES. WE WILL CONTINUE TO KEEP YOU AND YOUR STAFF INFORMED OF OUR CONCEPT AS THIS MOVEMENT OCCURS.
