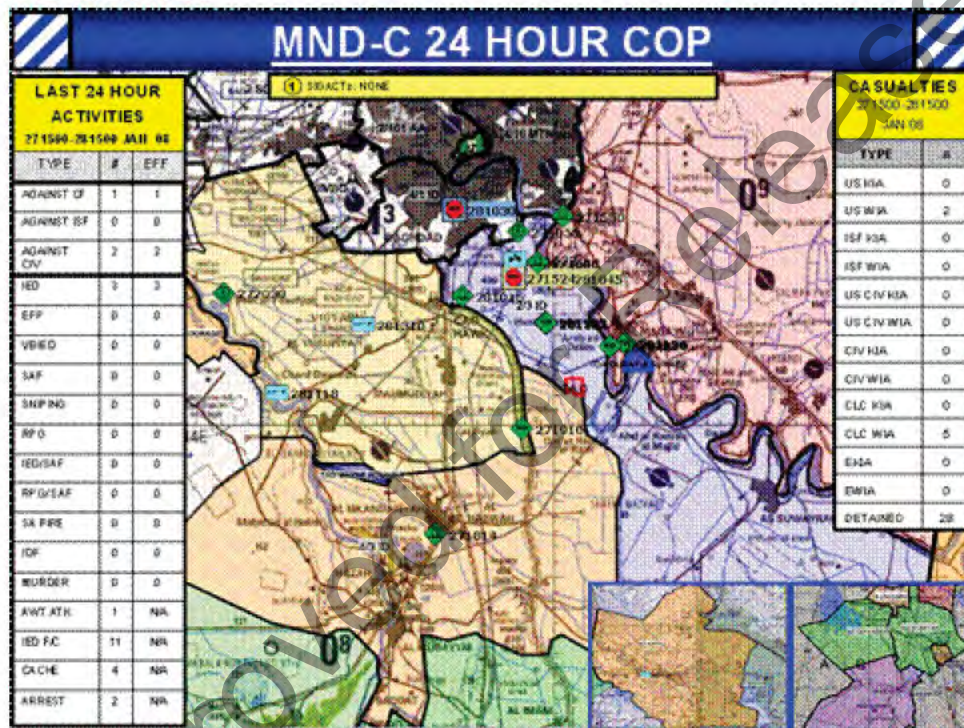

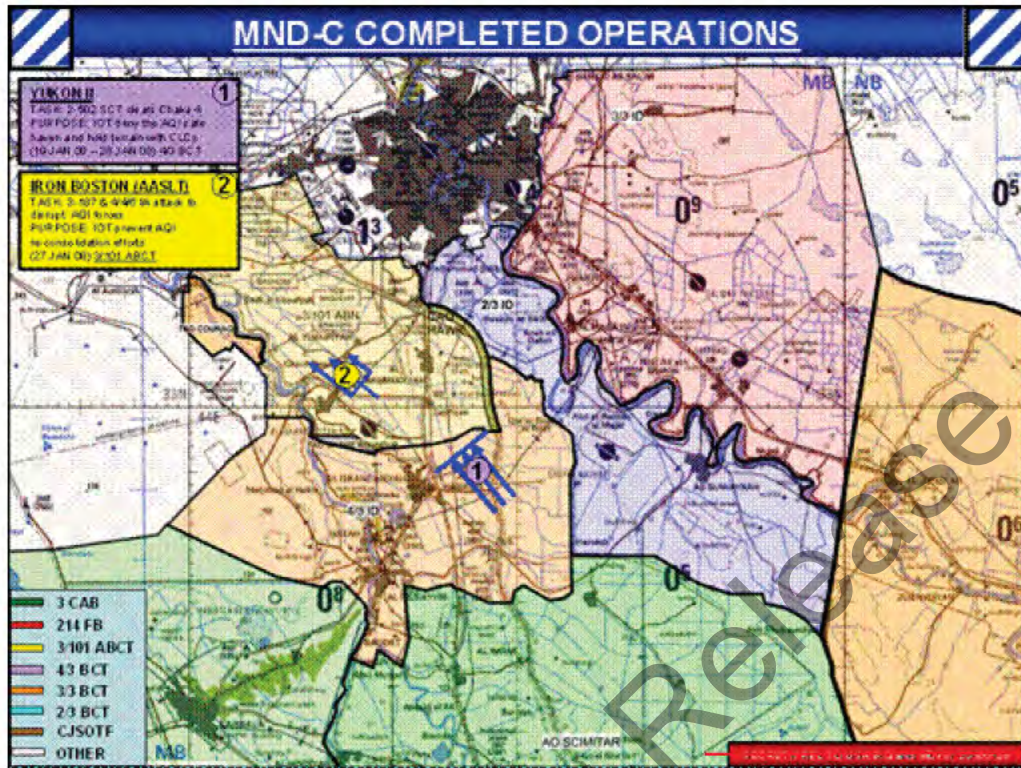

In the last 24 hours, we have completed 2 operations.

Yesterday, 4/3 completed Operation YUKON 2, a ten day clearance operation targeting AQI IED cells, resulting in 4 x IEDs found and cleared, 1 x HBIED destroyed, and 1 x cache cleared.

- DUE TO THE SUCCESS OF OPERATION IRON BOSTON, WE CAN EXPECT TO SEE A CONTINUING DISRUPTION EFFECT OF INSURGENT ACTIVITIES IN THE JANABI AREA. WITH ANOTHER DISCOVERY OF A WELL EMPLACED HIDE SIGHT, WE ASSESS THAT THE FIVE DETAINEES FOUND IN THE HIDE SIGHT WOULD HAVE MORE INFORMATION ON INSURGENT ACTIVITIES IN THE SAC.

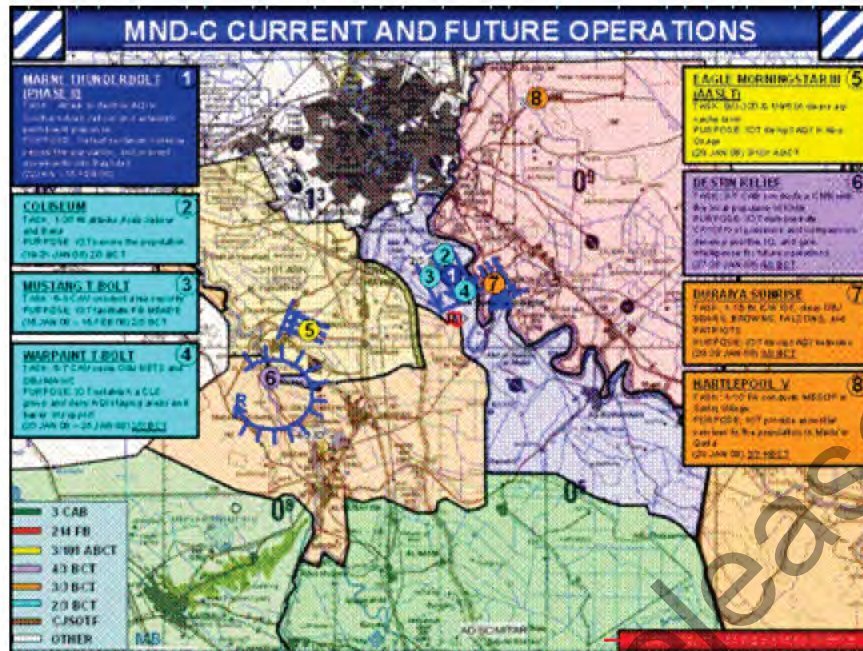

Yesterday, 3/101 BCT, and 4/6 IA, completed Operation IRON BOSTON, an AASLT attack in pursuit of AQI in the Sa'id Abdullah Corridor. This area, southwest of Mahmudiyah is a former AQI sanctuary which they have been trying to reestablish since TF MARNE operations to the west in Owesat, the south in Khidr and the east in Arab Jabour have made those areas untenable. The operation resulted in the discovery and destruction of an AQI hide site, and the detention of 25 x AQI members.



(CURRENT AND FUTURE OPERATIONS)

MND-Center units have 6 ongoing operations and 2 future operations.

3/101 ABCT

Tomorrow, 3/101 BCT begins Operation EAGLE MORNINGSTAR 3, an AASLT targeting an AQI IED cell in the Sa'id Abdullah Corridor.

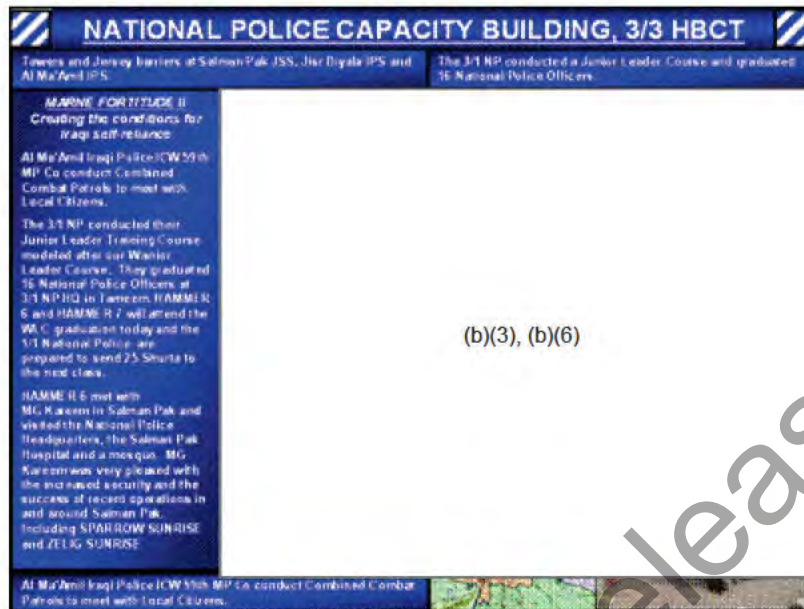
4/3 HBCT

4/3 BCT continues Operation DESTIN RELIEF, a Cooperative Medical Engagement in Khidr to bolster Gol effectiveness in north Babil and set the conditions for Iraqi self-reliance. So far, 180 Iraqi Citizens have received medical treatment during this Operation.

3/3 HBCT

Today 3/3 BCT, in coordination with 1/1 National Police, began Operation DURAIYA SUNRISE, a clearance operation to disrupt AQI operations in support of MARNE THUNDERBOLT and to set the conditions for upcoming MARNE GRAND SLAM. So far, this Operation has resulted in 4 x IEDs found and cleared.

Tomorrow, 3/3 BCT conducts HARTLEPOOL 5, a MEDOP in Sadiq Village west of Nahrwan to provide essential services to Internally Displaced Persons from Diyala.



(NATIONAL POLICE CAPACITY BUILDING)

The 3/1 National Police continue their capacity building by improving Force Protection, conducting operations and conducting their Junior Leader Training Course. The course is modeled after our Warrior Leader Course. Today, HAMMER 6 and HAMMER 7 will attend the WLC graduation of 16 National Policemen. The 1/1 National Police are prepared to send 25 Shurta to the next class.

- AWT was directed the CLC leaders house. CLC's reported the AWT dispersed the AQI.
- There was no casualties and only minor damage.
- This is the 5th consecutive CLC attack in the Northern portion of Warriors OE in six days, and indicates AQI's continued attempt to intimidate CLCs and reopen a historic line of communication through Mushada and Tarmiyah into Baghdad.

(EVENT 28 0900 // ADAMIYAH // CLC-UVB)

Our second CLC event occurred in Ahdamiyah.

At 0900 this morning, a CLC member (b)(6) reported through a phone tip that a under vehicle car bomb had been attached to his car.

- 3-7 CAV dispatched a patrol and EOD support to the location, but the device detonated before they arrived causing no injuries.
- EOD conducted PBA and secondary site search and collected evidence for WIT analysis.
- UVB IEDs, specifically RC IEDs place in or under CLC members vehicles continues to be a AQI TTP used to intimidate them from participation.
- There were two other noteworthy IEDs in our OE today.

At 28 1029 this morning, a MND-C patrol of HMMWVs and MRAPs was attacked with a large IED containing ball bearings.

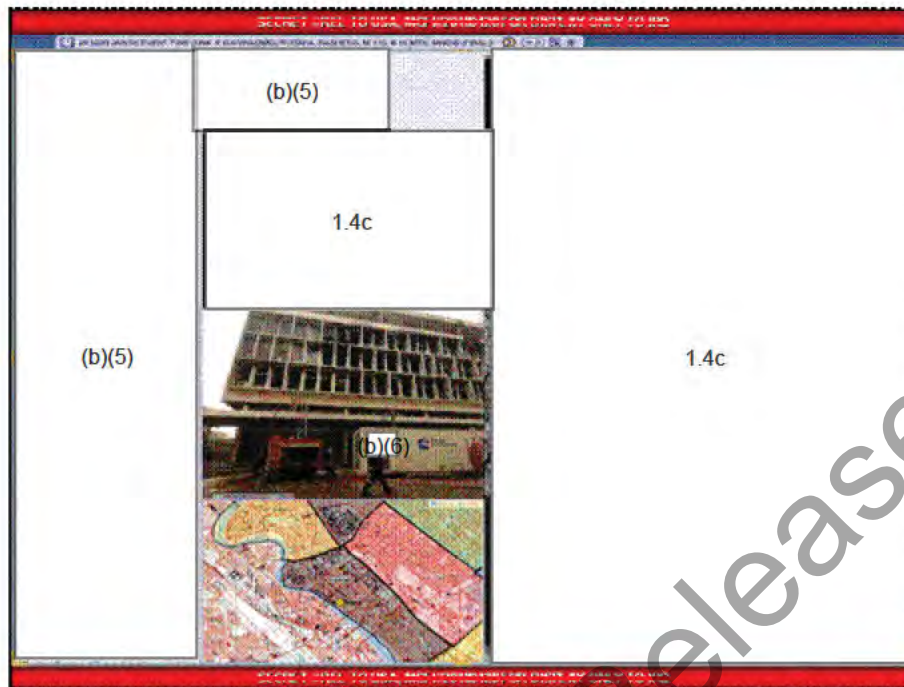
- The M1151 HMMWV was not penetrated but sustained some damage.
 - There were multiple injuries from the crew, but none were life threatening.
 - This attacked is assessed as AQI attempt to harass CF and maintain freedom of maneuver along route Jackson and IVO of Hayy Sadiyah.
 - The only change to our near term assessment is the indication through multi-source reporting of a heightened EFP threat along MSR Irish, specifically IVO CP 543.
- Additional testing of EFP components by SG cells that operate in Rashid, as well as receipt of supplies indicates this threat will remain elevated for the next 24 – 72 hours.

In the last 24 Hours, MND-B conducted 6x company sized operations. Of note:

4/1ID conducted OPN BLACK LION BUSHMASTER III, a cordon & search in West Rashid to capture AQI cell members. The operations resulted in five detainees, all from the battalion's target list.

4/10MTN conducted OPN THUNDER BULLRUN IV, a raid in Karadah to capture two HVIs, resulted in 2x Detainees, neither of which were the targets.

In the north, 2/25ID is conducting OPN ILIO' IMI, a clearing operation in the Al Malik Orchard to capture AQI and deny them use of this terrain. The operation began at 0220 this morning and so far has nothing significant to report.



Early this morning (0120), the Central Bank of Iraq suffered total loss of substantial administrative documents from the office of the governor of the CBI to include the accounting department and back-up documents. The fire was first reported at 0120 by guard towers at BAS JSS. Iraqi EOD speculate that the fire began on the 2nd floor of the building which was unoccupied during the night time. The guards first noticed a problem around 0030 when the security cameras in the building malfunctioned. Guards called the fire department and BG Razweel, Chief of the Rusafa Fire Department, responded but was not able to save the building. The building is still standing, however it was gutted by the fire. Local security leaders conducted a security meeting about the incident today, but we have yet to receive a report as to their plans.

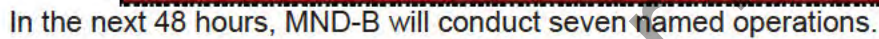
The fire gutted the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd floors, destroying/damaging most records, their backup, and the data servers. The vaults themselves are intact.

The bottom line is that the bank is operational, but the records to reconcile accounts are damaged and possibly destroyed. There were limited or no backups to this information. The affects the ability to reconcile yearly accounts from banks and for Ministry of Finance and other ministries. It will also affect the ability to reconcile investments, to include the Development Fund for Iraq.

Investigative team consisting of the FBI Major Crimes Task Force is leading an investigation with the Iraqis. The team consists of reps from ATF (2x), FBI (2x), legal attaché, and the head of the MCTF. Two of the agents are trained in arson investigation.

MOI's head of the Baghdad Fire Department is leading their part of the investigation.

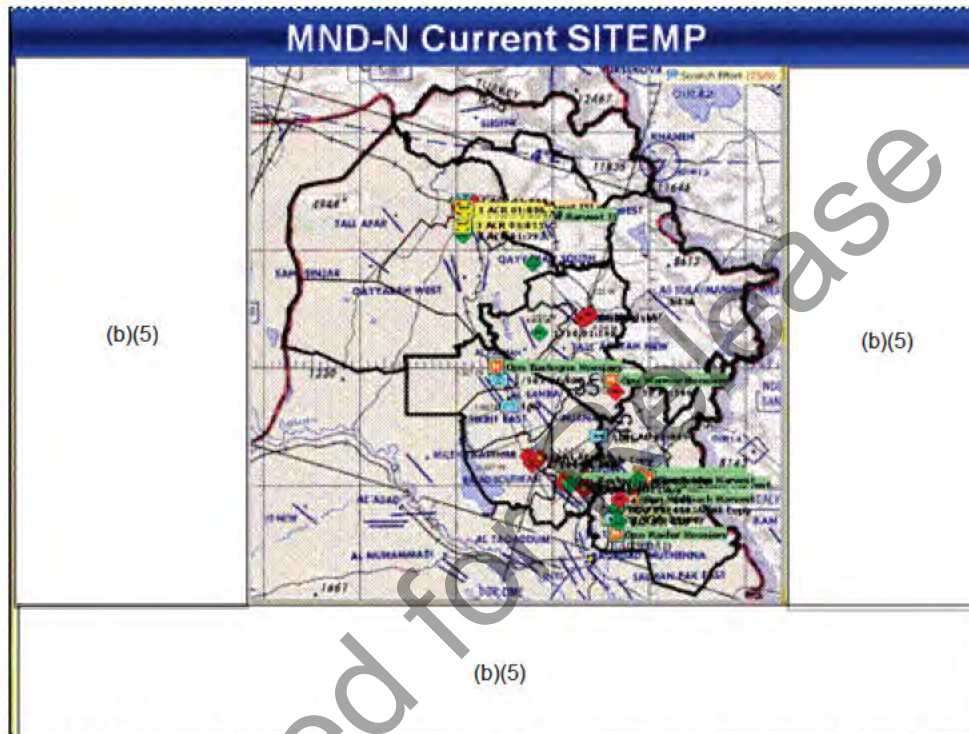
The bank plans on resuming normal operations tomorrow (29 Jan 09). Personnel are moving into the supervision building next door.



4/10MTN will conduct a raid and clearin in operation in New Baghdad to disrupt Special Groups in those areas.

2/25ID will conduct an air assault to clear an area of suspected AQI caches.

MND-N Iron Soldiers:



During the past 24 hrs we faced 30 attacks and 3 CCIRs. 1 I will cover in Mosul.

Operations ISO Iron Harvest continues today with 11 company combined level or higher operations across our AOR. Sir, tonight I would like to brief you on our operations and significant events across the Provinces followed by update on our railroad status.

Ninewa 3ACR

In Ninewa, Brave Rifles remains focused on Rifles Harvest II operations. 3/3 ACR ICW 2IA and IPs maintains presence in western Mosul and continue to improve COPs along RTE Barracuda. This evening they will establish an additional COP vic of a gas station on the far western end of RTE Barracuda Havoc Harvest IV.

A CCIR of note- 3ACR 01:812

The IA continues to have success as their footprint in Mosul continues to grow. At the request of MG Riyadh, the BTR-80 Company from 4/9 IA arrived in Mosul this weekend. The company consists of 105 soldiers from 2/1/4/9 IA with 10 x BTR-80s with 3 small water trailers. The duration of their stay is unknown at this time. Additionally, 3/4/2 IA conducted an 1.4c raid in the Al Salam neighborhood of Mosul this Saturday. 1x AQI/ISI was detained. 1.4c led to the discovery of

the cache which was found in the Domiz Somer neighborhood (SE Mousl). 4x AQI/ISI were detained at the site of the cache. Shown here are the contents of the cache. The items in the cache were moved to FOB Lion and are awaiting transportation by DIV EOD for disposal. Also this weekend, Iraqi SF conducted a [redacted] 1.4c in northern Mosul resulting in the capture of the Jackpot and 3 detainees. The [redacted] (b)(6) [redacted] (b)(6) is a midlevel financier for JAI and ISI in Mosul. [redacted] b 6 was expected to travel to Syria in the near future to purchase weapons and explosives for use in Iraq. On a good news note, the Iraqi WLC class of 03-08 graduated this Saturday from the Q-West course. The 24 security force graduates endured approximately 4 weeks of intense training to include academics, room clearing, obstacle course, PT test, wpns qualification, combatives, and basic patrol techniques.

This weekend (Friday), MG Wathiq conducted successful engagements and meetings with all major leaders in the Mosul Police Department as well as coordination with MG Muthaa. All ISF leaders in Ninewa agreed to not make any near term security plans for establishment of new IP and IA positions in Western Mosul nor shift any IP leaders before the next PDOP was appointed.

Finally, efforts to fix the fuel shortage in western Ninewa are in progress. Western Ninewa has been short for quite sometime due to both successful AQI attacks on bridges as well as the inefficient method of fuel distribution in Ninewa. Rifles is currently organizing all available fuel trucks from Tall Afar, Sinjar, Rabiya, and Baij under a Coalition Escort to the Baji Oil Refinery. This event will occur in the next 2 days with a CF presence at the refinery to ensure a rapid turn around and successful short term solution for fuel in the West.

Kirkuk 1/10 MTN

In Kirkuk, Warrior maintains steady state operations with TST and ARF missions across the province. Last night 1-87 IN, in response to a local tip, conducted a TST mission NW of Hawijah in the town of Al Mansoria in order to kill capture Bde HVI #2 Yasser Abdullah Gha-deer. Once the Scout Weapons Team approached the target objective, 15 military aged males were seen splitting up into 3 different groups and fleeing into the northeast outskirts of town. B Co was able to detain 4 of the fleeing individuals, one of which was the BDE HVI #2. We are currently obtaining HVI # 2's background from [redacted] 1.4c.

Of note, recent [redacted] 1.4c indicates a positive step forward stating, that the Iraqi police headquarters in Kirkuk city hired 50 female IP officers. Upon completion of IP training the female officers will all work within Kirkuk city at various IP stations.

Finally, [redacted] (b)(6) the former commander of 3-2/4 IA Bn assumed command of 2/4 IA BDE this weekend. W6 describes him as very energetic and focused on improving the professionalism of 2/4 and enhancing the public perception of the Iraqi Army. An example of this is his surprise inspection yesterday of the Iraqi Army Checkpoints on the southern outskirts of Kirkuk. W6 expects [redacted] b 6 hands on approach will result in a reduction in corruption and increase in professionalism and efficiency at IA CPs around the AO.

Salah ad Din

In SaD, Bastogne continues to conduct counter insurgency operations focusing on disrupting and denying AQI safe haven and support zones in Samarra and along MSR Tampa. Yesterday, EOD responded to 3 cache sites NW of FOB Summerall which were initially spotted by an AWT on a routine patrol. Of significance- The 2nd cache site contained 6 EFPs at 75lbs a piece and a 125 mm rocket launch rail system. EOD assessed the EFPs as ineffective due to the [REDACTED] 1.4g

[REDACTED] 1.4g. The 3rd cache was a small HME factory containing 10x 50lb bags of HME, 60x 50lb bags of ammonium nitrate, and various common hand tools. The contents of the cache were destroyed on site.

Diyala 4/2 SBCT

In Diyala, BB operations continue in the hold phase with units focusing on reconstruction efforts. Raiders continue to put IA in the lead as they conduct HA and CME missions. This weekend 3/2 and 5IA treated over 231 patients in Barwana. Projects in the BB continue at a steady pace dependent on the availability of contracts and material on hand. Yesterday 3/2 facilitated a meeting between the Mayor of Muqdadiah and leaders from the surrounding towns of Hembis, Abu Musa, Lehib, Al Ali, Abu Dihin, Tihar, Sinira, Guam, Al Khala, and Khalaniyah. The parties involved discussed the establishment of CLCs and restoration of electricity in the area. The mayor affirmed that he would work to reestablish kerosene shipments and electricity to the area. Following the meeting the mayor returned to his hometown of Hamada for the first time a year and a half. We assess this meeting will provide the momentum needed to reestablish PDS and other essential services with the cooperation of the mayor and the surrounding leadership.

Tomorrow night, 2-23 IN will clear the village of Jazeera located just NE of Muqdadiah to destroy suspected AQI/ AAS cells operating in the village. Jazeera is known for AQI ambushes and flash TCPs, it is estimated that approximately 40 AQI/ CIS reside there. (Blackfoot Harvest IV)

Blackhawk Harvest operations south of Baqubah along Vanessa ended last night with 2-1 CAV's ground exfill to refit and rearm. We will update you on the final BDA roll up in tomorrow's BUA.

Infrastructure Update (Heavy Railroad Status)

Sir, this slide shows the current status of the MND-N heavy Railroad Tracks. The lines in green have been tested and are operational. Yellow lines have not yet been tested. Red lines are either blocked or damaged tracks and blue have no reported status by the IRR pending inspection.

Ministry of Oil is working with the Ministry of Transportation to allow the Bayji Refinery to use the rail lines to ship HFO to Mussayib Power Plant and refined product to Anbar in lieu of the 100 truck convoys.

Concurrently, Iraqi Rail Road workers are training at the Bayji Refinery for the next 3 weeks learning how to properly load the rail cars with fuel. The majority of Iraqi Railroad experts in the fields of conductors, inspectors and loading operators left in 2003 and have never returned. Upon completion of training, we expect to see 1 train per day departing Bayji with either HFO or refined product.

We assess if this operation remains on schedule, it will allow increased refinery at the BOR by reducing the HFO storage limitations. It will also allow for less MNF-W Fuel Pushes and eventually will lead to the elimination of the need for the MNF-W Fuel push convoys. Trains will also allow transport of bulk goods required for other businesses.

Efforts to fix the fuel shortage in western Ninewa are in progress. Western Ninewa has been short for quite sometime due to both successful AQI attacks on bridges as well as the inefficient method of fuel distribution in Ninewa. Rifles is currently organizing all available fuel trucks from Tall Afar, Sinjar, Rabiya, and Baij under a Coalition Escort to the Baij Oil Refinery. This event will occur in the next 2 days with a CF presence at the refinery to ensure a rapid turn around and successful short term solution for fuel in the West.

There are two fuel pushes scheduled. On 30 JAN 08 a 3IA escort element, accompanied by 3IA MiTT element will link up with 6 tanker trucks vic Tal Afar and escort them to Baiji Oil Refinery (BOR) to receive emergency shipment of kerosene for return transport to Tal Afar region. The convoy will also be escorted by SWT. The second fuel push is an un escorted ground convoy from the BOR to Diyala, Date and frequency TBD.

Non Lethal

Traveling Judges heard 3 cases on Sunday. The judges will be escorted back to Baghdad on 1 Feb.

- One person was convicted of terrorism, and received a life sentence.
- One person was convicted of terrorism, but because crime predated the Anti Terrorism law of 2005, he received the maximum sentence of 15 years. However, due to his age of 70 and his ill health, the court determined that he was an undue burden on the prison system and released him.
- One hearing on a case resulted in a reversal by the Court of Cessation. Based on evidence that a Baddush inmate convicted of beheading 20 people on videotape was actually in custody when one of the murders occurred, the Court returned one charge of murder to CCC-I for rehearing.

In Diyala, Governor Raad is pushing to convince the central government of his way-ahead for CLCs in Diyala. He wants to hire them initially as provincial facility protective services and eventually transition them as a labor force to fill vacant jobs within the various ministries throughout the province. Important in this initiative is that the Governor recognizes the issue and has developed a plan of action to remedy the situation.

MND-CS White Eagle:

The overall situation in the MND-CS AOR remains STABLE, with no attacks against CFs or ISF during this reporting period.

A balanced operation approach continues with current operations and the Polish RIP TOA. Although conducting limited operational patrols, the division continues supporting Op LION POUNCE. Op BTIGHTEN DAY continues in the Rifat district of Diwo with day 7 of a small scale neighborhood clean up project, employing 450 Iraqis, and the future planning a targeted CiMIC opns for the Polish 10 rotation.

Yesterday, based on a LN tip, the IA discovered a cache in the AL WAHDA district of Diwo. Items recovered included 3 EFPs, 1 X 155mm round wired with the blasting cap, 7 X RPG boosters; 18 X mortar fuses; 1 X 82mm base plate; 4 X anti-tank mines; and 3+KGs of TNT. This is the third such cache discovered in the past 2 weeks in this area, with on the 20th, ODA 165 discovery a larger, but similar type weapons cache. MND-CS will continue to work our sources along with the ISFs to gather future actionable intelligence relating to this specific part of the city.

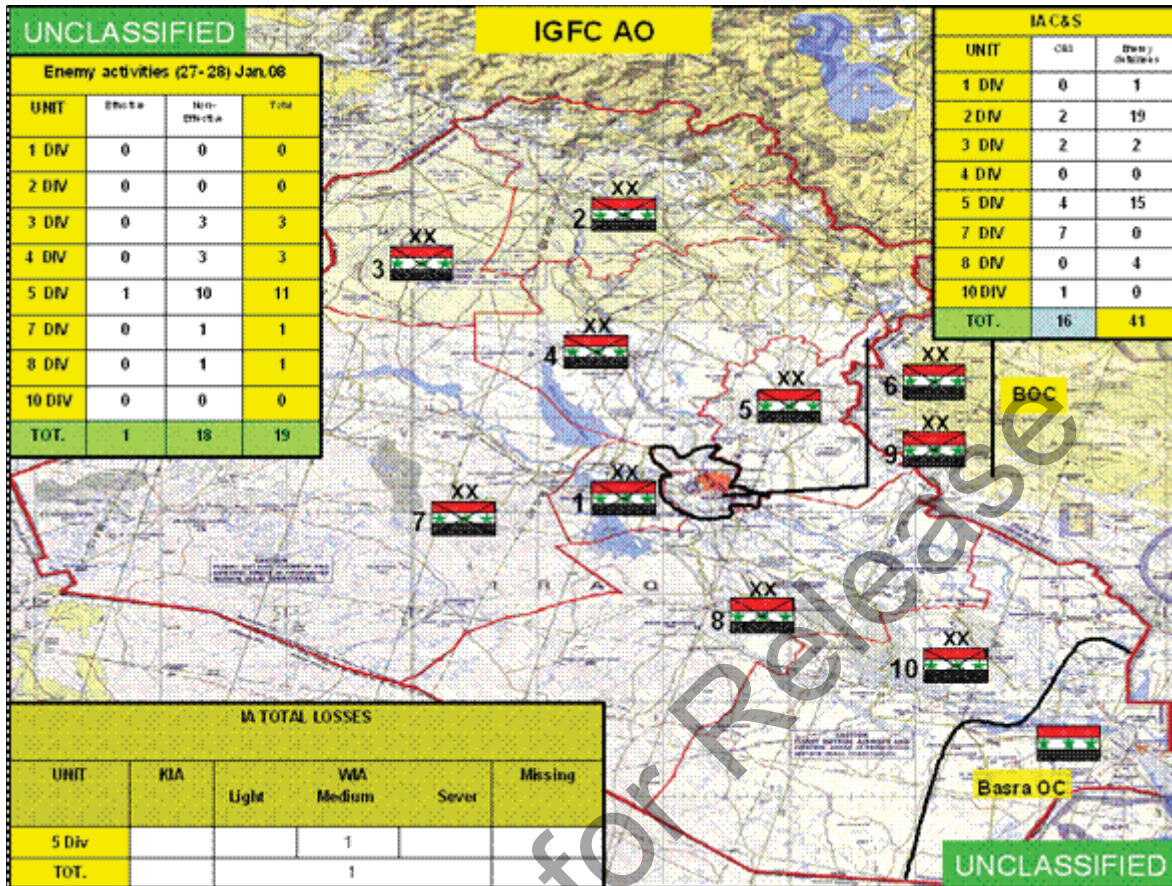
As a summary of CIMIC action for the Polish IX rotation, they completed 279 CERP projects at a cost of \$18MLN. As the projects focused on providing humanitarian support, while improving basic services, such as water, sewer, electrical projects, and education. These projects also targeted the high level of unemployment within the province. IOT track the outcome of these non kinetic actions, the metric tracked reflected approximately 150,000 Iraqis benefited in some fashion. 65 Micro Grant projects in the amount of \$429K were completed stimulating small business growth.

As previously briefed with the province having a large agriculture footprint, the Polish 9th rotation aggressively supported the Council of Sheiks for Diwaniyah Chamber of Agriculture. With the support from MND-CS concentrating on humanitarian aid in the form of fertilizer and equipment, this Polish rotation, surged that effort in the past 3 weeks, finishing 7 of the final 9 sub-districts. Of the total of 15, 13 sub districts are complete with the final 2 sub districts ongoing. At the conclusion of this effort, 12,000 tons of fertilizer will have been delivered in support for 15,500 small/medium size farmers.

Today MG BUK conducted the weekly security IPR with MG OTHMAN, BG SAFA JASSIM, Chief of Provincial Security Council Sheik HASSAN and Chief of PJCC LTC MALIKI. Overall assessment by the committee is optimistic, of the security situation, but cautious. As briefed last Saturday, the committee also re-visited last weeks encounter of the Iraqi Parliament members. They organized a demonstration on Salem Street, in the neighborhood of KIFAH, and passed out flyers in an attempt to recruit for Sadr. Also discussed, was Iraqi 1.4c suggesting that the soldiers of heaven are attempting to move into Diwo; and the need for the next CLC organization in the area between Afak and Al Budayr. tP is currently working this issue, with a little resistance from the local tribes concerning boundary issues. Also suggested by Gen Uthman was the need for combined FUOPs and to re-gather some of the earlier CLCs Sheiks to re-emphasize their responsibility of timely information within their given tribal area.

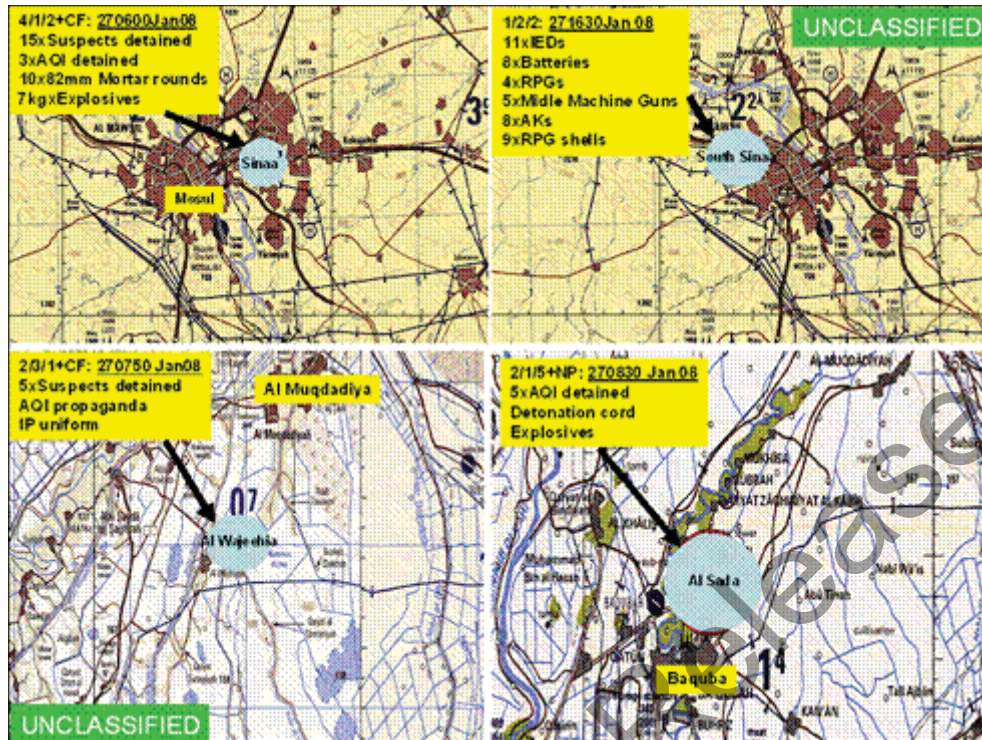

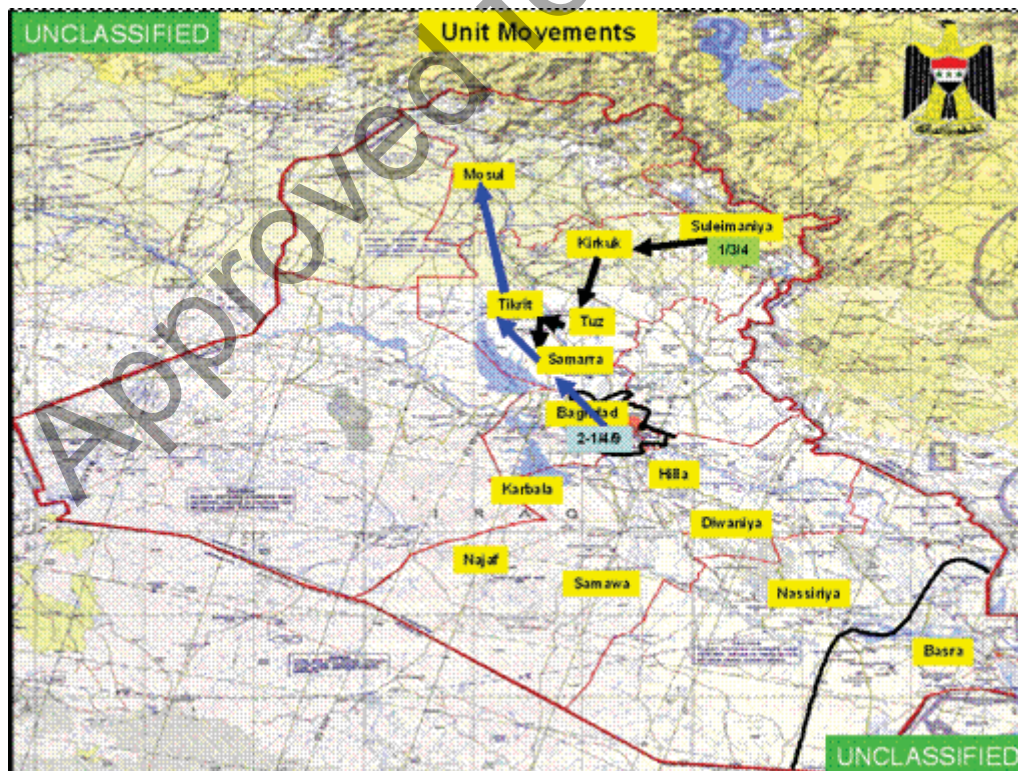
This morning the PM issued an order to NOC and to the AL Mosul Dam director to stop Using the Dam for military and civilian Traffic.

24 Jan at 1000, the Ninewa IP Leader was killed along with another IP KIA, 7 IP WIA, and 1 LN WIA with a Suicide Bomber attacked whom was wearing a LT IP uniform; the IP Leader was inspecting the building which was destroyed the day before due to planting explosives inside the building which resulted in 12 LNs KIA, 89 LNs WIA, and 5 IA WIA; the IA got a tip about a Cache in that building but the EOD team discovered the trap and while they were trying to flee the site the explosion occurred wounding the 5 men.

at 2200, an IED exploded on the Sistany representative in Karbala, resulting in wounding the sheikh, killing 2 of the sheikh's body Guards and wounding another 2.

FOR SUSTAINMENT STATUS, ALL GS AND DS HUBS CURRENTLY AVERAGE 7.4 DAYS OF SUPPLY JP8 ON HAND AND AVERAGE 10.8 DAYS OF SUPPLY DF2 ON HAND. THERE ARE NO OPERATIONAL IMPACTS.

IN SUPPORT OF OPERATIONS, THE 507TH CSG HAS COMPLETED OPERATION ROLLING TIGERS, WHICH PROVIDED HEAVY LIFT TO MNF-W IN SUPPORT OF OPERATION PHANTOM PHOENIX, IN ADDITION TO THE RETROGRADE OF EQUIPMENT IN PREPARATION FOR REDEPLOYMENT OPERATIONS.
