



There has already been more Surface to Air Fire (SAFIRE) incidents in 2007 than there were in 2006, with Belt Fed (BF)/ Heavy Machine Gun (HMG) as the most significant increase. In 2007, nearly 190 BF/ HMG SAFIRE incidents occurred, resulting in six-downed CF aircraft. Also in 2007, there were 23 assessed or confirmed MANPADS SAFIRE incidents, resulting in two-downed CF aircraft; this is consistent with the number of incidents in 2006. HMGs are less expensive, in wider distribution, and easier to operate than MANPADS, which are traditionally the most dangerous SAFIRE threat to aircraft. The increase in SAFIRE incidents, coupled with improved insurgent BF/ HMG TTPs, likely led to 2007 having twice the number of aircraft shot down than in 2006. However, the number of effective SAFIRE attacks by insurgents has dropped significantly in the last four months with the last CF aircraft being shot down/ hard landing on 31 Jul 07.. This can be attributed to CLCs and Awakening Groups in addition to a greater number of CF soldiers on ground shifting from FOB/

- COB to Small Patrol Stations (SPS) disrupting the flow of insurgents and caches, while taking the fight to AQI. Also, the "freeze" has likely affected JAM's ability to conduct SAFIRE operations.
- There were 27 SAFIRE incidents in the past two weeks 16 small arms, six BF/ HMG, four rockets, and one RPG. This is within the norms for 2007.
 The majority of these attacks occurred in MND-North and MND-Center.
- There are indications that insurgent groups are planning at least some SAFIRE attacks. Reporting suggests deliberate observation of aircraft operations in certain areas to establish patterns and the best location to carry out attacks. Insurgents most often engage CF aircraft from vegetation along riverbanks and from urban areas, in order to maximize cover and concealment, provide an obstacle between themselves and potential responding QRF and to aid in exfiltrating the area after the attack.
- SAFIRE incidents have mainly been opportunistic attacks. Insurgent elements, including Shi'a extremists groups and particularly AQI, will continue these attacks to down CF aircraft. The greatest threat to CF aircraft likely remains attacks involving BF/ HMG and small arms fire, with MANPADS remaining as a credible threat.
