Forwarded recommendations to FUOPs for consolidated staff recommendation.

**6. TOPIC:** MNF-I Force Re-posture OPT (No Change)

**DISCUSSION:** MNC-I Planners participated in a Joint Theater Re-posture OPT with MNF-I at al-Faw Palace on Monday the 5<sup>th</sup> of November and a follow VTC with SPA Plans on the evening of the 7<sup>th</sup> of November. MNF-I SPA plans presented their assumptions about the environment for both the near and long-term. Further they described the conditions that allow MNF-I to reduce from 20-15-12-10-7-4 BCTs. Subordinate commands briefed their plans to support a conditions-based re-posture of forces down to the Steady State (4+1+1 BCTs). MNC-I submitted an approved list major tasks for each of the reductions from 20-4 BCTs. CJSOTF-AP tasks were presented in conjunction with MNC-I. During the VTC on the 7<sup>th</sup> of November XVIII ABV Chief of Plans & Policy participated and discussed with the SPA Plans Director his planner's objectives for attending the Planners Session. XVIII ABC Force Generation, Basing, Sustainment and Intel planners departed Fort Bragg on the 7<sup>th</sup> of November for Qatar.

**NEXT ACTION:** MNC-I planners depart Iraq on 9 November to attend the Theater Posture Planners Session. Four planners will attend representing Operations, Sustainment/Logistics, Transition and Training Teams, Joint Fires and Special Operations. XVIII Airborne Corps will

**7. TOPIC:** Operation Phantom Hammer (Clear Diwaniya) (Update)

**DISCUSSION:** Operation Phantom Hammer is a Corps-level named operation; a four-phased CONOP designed to regain control of Diwaniya from insurgent elements. MND-CS is **currently supporting the 8IA led operation called Lion Pounce, which will establish JSS#3 and several security outposts in Diwaniyah in order to neutralize the effects of Jaysh al Hussain, the new name of the Militant JAM in Diwaniyah.** MND-CS has also planned a Division-level named operation similar in scope to Phantom Hammer called Final Strike.

**WAY AHEAD:** Operation Phantom Hammer is BPT and conditions-based. Friendly conditions include the availability of enabler support, IP training, IP plan to retain cleared ground, and the Class IV/patrol base construction plan beyond that of JSS 2 construction (Operation Oil Drop).

**8. TOPIC:** Maritime CONOPS (formerly called Riverine Ops) (No Change)

**DISCUSSION:** The Maritime CONOPS OPT convened on 23 Oct 07 with the arrival of Naval planners from the Naval Expeditionary Combatant Command (NEEC). The mission analysis ISO a recommended Maritime Conop in the ITO is currently in progress.

**DISCUSSION:** C3 Plans presented LTG Odierno with decision points regarding timelines for 2/1 AD's deployment to MND-C, backfilling 3/3ID and for the redeployment of 2SCR within the ITO, backfilling 4/SBCT in June 2008. While there has been no change to current plans, decision points detailed when plans could still be altered and what risks would result if decisions were made after that time.

No anticipated delays to transition. HQ IGFC staff visit to 7IA 20-23 Oct 07 reported as successful. CDR 7IA gave a backbrief to CG IGFC given on 24 Oct 07.

To preserve combat power, and an optimal ratio of HQ to subordinate forces as BCTs depart theater, plans is determining the HQ staff requirements for varying levels of BCTs assigned in theaters, identifying any excesses in HQ staff personnel and redundancies between MNC-I and MNF-I. Consolidate all tasks from C3 sections and presented EXSUM to DCOS 14 SEP.

**12. TOPIC:** Elections (Update)

**– ELECTION NOTES ARE UNCLASSIFIED –**

**DISCUSSION:** A draft copy of the Provincial Powers Law and a draft copy of the Elections Law (Governorates, Districts, and Sub-Districts Elections Law) are both posted on [redacted] (b)(6)

[redacted] (b)(6) elections portal: [redacted] (b)(6) This legislation has not progressed beyond the second reading, but reviewing these draft documents gives us the opportunity to see how the PM office intends to craft the legislation. Provincial Elections could occur within about 5 months of the Elections Law passing. The next step for the IHEC is to confirm the heads of the 19 Governmental Electoral Offices (GEO) (one per province and two in Baghdad). Current estimation is that Voter Registration will occur on or about 15 January 2008 and Provincial Elections will occur no earlier than 1 June 2008.

**DISCUSSION:** No Change to LNO Plan (2 x package). XVIII ABC has been working on their next PDSS, but no changes to their LNO plan has emerged at this point.

**14. TOPIC:** Base Consolidation and Closure (No Change)

**DISCUSSION:** Base transfer / closures are a conditions based approach driven by three major considerations: stability in the AO, ISF ability/capability to assume & hold battle space, and

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funding for base consolidation. The current methodology is bottom-up driven with MSC nominating bases for transfer / closure and MNC-I approve closure requests and supports/monitors the MNC-I SOP base closure process. MNF-West's Camp Corregidor is approved for closure for 20-Dec-07, closure efforts in progress. MNF-West has submitted Property Closure Notification requests for Combat Outpost (20-Dec-07) and Blue Diamond (01-Mar-08), staffing is at MNC-I HQ. Cedar II capabilities move to Adder is ongoing with 2-year plan, new date for Cedar II closure is Jun-09.

The MNC-I CG reviewed the Basing EXSUM and signed a letter to the MNF-I CG of the MNC-I produced Strategic Over-watch COB list (Q-West, Anaconda, Al Asad, VBC, Delta, Adder, & BAS.) This letter is at the MNF-I CG desk for review/approval; MNF-I SPA concurs with MNC-I proposal.

MNC-I Basing gave the Basing Operations briefing to the CG Saturday 06-Oct-07. The briefing lasted 30min with the DCG, CoS, DCoS, and C7 in attendance. The basing current management plan and way ahead were accepted by the CG.

**Next Action:** The Basing OPT continues to work base closure staff planning to produce draft-ready-to-use base closure plans for every base. This produces off-the-shelf plans that 18 ABN Corps can use as the situation dictates (leveraging III Corps expertise) and raises significant issues for resolution now to produce base closure and base operations enablers in the future, (i.e. increased DRMS demilitarization capability, increased incinerators for waste destruction, scrap metal [on bases] processing and removal.)

**Future Actions:** IZ Transition: COA#2 is still in effect (No change) JASG-C is producing COA#3 which entails the consolidation of MNF-I presence in the IZ from 13 to 3 locations. The transition requires the transfer of personnel from Bases Union I & III be complete ~APR-09, the relocation of CSH to VBC (Est. transfer complete ~JUL-09) and the relocation of GRD to VBC (~OCT-09). Bases will be transferred from the owners to JASG-C; JASG-C will then hand over to an Iraqi agency when the IZ transition activities are complete.

The Basing Management Working Group meeting is conducted weekly and the Executive Base Management Board is once a month on the 1<sup>st</sup> Saturday in place of the BMWG.

**15. TOPIC:** Establishment of Judicial Complexes (No Change)

**DISCUSSION:** During the conduct of the MNC-I OPORD 07-01 Brief, the CG MNC-I directed the MNC-I SJA to assume responsibility for the establishment of safe, secure judicial complexes throughout Iraq, modeled after the Rule of Law Complex in the Rusafa District of Baghdad.

Additionally, the CG MNC-I provided guidance to establish the first site in the city of Ramadi. Initial planning began with the development of a Concept Brief, which was briefed to the MNC-I C3. Upon briefing the C3, the MNC-I SJA section published WARNO 008 to provide notice to the major subordinate commands about this initiative and to assemble the Corps Judicial Complex Working Group (JCWG). Members of the JCWG include representatives from the Corps SJA, C4, C6, C7, C8, C9, and AT-FP sections as well as a representative from the Joint Contracting Command.

- On 12 Aug, the SJA Rule of Law attorney accompanied a group consisting of DoS, GRD, LAOTF, and MNF-I personnel to Ramadi to visit proposed sites for the Ramadi Judicial Complex. The short-term solution, approved by Chief Judge Medhat of the Higher Juridical

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Council, is to renovate the Ramadi Government Center to house Anbar Criminal Court (ACC) #18. That way, the ACC can begin trying terrorism cases arising within Anbar Province. The long-term solution is to locate a Judicial Complex on FOB Blue Diamond.

- A \$300,000 PR&C has been approved by the MNC-I CoS for a GRD Site Assessment at FOB Blue Diamond for the establishment of a Judicial Complex.
- Initial Site Assessment has been completed. Overall cost of project is now estimated to be \$11.6 million. Total completion time for project would be 120 days (assuming complete availability of site).

**1. TOPIC:** 11 IA HQ Force Generation and Deployment for FAQ (No Change)

**DISCUSSION:** 11 IA is a PMI unit currently undergoing force generation at Old MOD. As of 23 September 2007, 1/11 IA is under the administrative control of the 11<sup>th</sup> Division, but remains under the operational control of Rusafa Area Command and the Baghdad Operations Command. During the OPT MNSTC-I announced that the HMMWVs that were to be issued to 3/11 and 2/11 as part of FORCEGEN had been redirected by the PM. G4 ISF is attempting to determine where they have been redirected to. This moved 11 IA to the head of the list for the HMMWV/MRAP transfer. Could potentially impact FAQ rotation plan which could, in turn, lead to an AWOL issue among deployed units.

**2. TOPIC:** Seaport Security (Update)

**DISCUSSION:** MNF -I planning efforts for seaports began 29 Mar and included Maritime Strategy development, security planning on seaports. Leaders from the Iraqi Navy, Coast Guard and CF focused on the development of a Memorandum of Understanding for combined maritime operations. Past seaport conference at MNF-I, 24-25 Jul 07, identified significant gaps in coastal security coverage, both procedural and physical. This gap is currently not patrolled by Iraqi Navy, CG or CTF [1.4a] and extends from the last CP on the Iraqi side of the Shatt Al Arab [29° 57'N, 048° 30'E] to the deep water mark off the entrance to the Shatt Al Arab at [29° 51'N, 048° 45'E], a distance of around 10 nautical miles (18km). General Mohan, CG, Basra Operations Command has recommended that DBE Coast Guard be replaced by IA personnel based on the perception that the Coast Guard is ineffective due to corruption. A U.S. Navy planning team has visited MNC-I and MND-SE to determine what options are viable for increased border security on the Shatt Al Arab waterway, the Maysan Marsh area and other coastal waterways.

**3. TOPIC:** IAIB Transition (Update)

**DISCUSSION:** Construction efforts along the exclusion zone are still significantly behind and the first location to become available will not assist in housing newly converted BNs. With the exception of 1/5/4, exclusion zone basing will not keep pace with the current retraining plan.

- 3/5/4 currently at Karkh Water Treatment Facility (KWTF). 2/5/4 is at K1 for training.
- LORs supporting the FMS cases to field additional SIB units with added equipment were returned to MNSTC-I SAO UNSIGNED. MoD's stated reason was that IAIBs are no longer a priority for the Iraqi Army and MoD for 2008.
- No equipment or vehicles will be issued to any IAIBs units beyond the third iteration
- CMA-TT and MNSTC-I remain firm on their plan to NOT expend ISFF on these units, without mutual MoD support, which does not look like it will happen for 2008.
- The basing plan beyond Phase I of the "Exclusion Zone" (Bayji to Kirkuk) also remains highly questionable at this time.
- IAIB way ahead was discussed at length during IGFC PCM/ORA on 14 NOV. IGFC sees the benefit of the IAIB Transition and wants it to continue. We will continue to engage on all fronts.

**4. TOPIC:** Build POE Capability - Border Strategy, Security and Interdiction (Update)

**DISCUSSION:** MNF-I published the modification FRAGO (Securing the Borders Strategy) this month as part of the Iraqi National Border Control Plan. The modification of the strategy serves to reinvigorate and refocus MNF-I's efforts with the GOI on borders enforcement. The strategy will serve as the basis for all ongoing border planning efforts to include interdicting the flow of foreign fighters, building POE capability and seaport / air port strategy. MNC-I continues to build permanent presence at designated POEs IOT disrupt foreign terrorists and facilitators cross-border movement, illegal munitions smuggling and other nefarious cross-border activities. POE enhancement remains a priority and continues to improve as part of the plan. POETT at POE Zurbatia and BTT Region III DBE have successfully implemented POE and DBE Checkpoint operational checklists to standardize POE and Checkpoint operations. This is the first successful reported implementation of this type of necessary program at any DBE facility in Iraq.

**5. TOPIC:** Seaport-Airport Transfer of Authority (Update)

**DISCUSSION:** The supervision of seaports / airports now falls under the MoI / DBE effective 24 Jul 07. Key ministerial negotiations and administrative requirements associated with this action will continue to facilitate / complete the transfer process. It is assessed that the Umm Qasr port manager [redacted] (b)(6) is likely to retain his position for the foreseeable future, as is the port director [redacted] (b)(6) (who is based in Basrah). The PM has appointed Director Generals (DG) for 4 seaports and will come under MOI authority. The MOT does not concur with the decision. The PM believes that ports are a national concern and he does not believe that the MOT should have overall control. The MOT is fighting with the PM on this and hence the delay in the TOA. The DG will be responsible for the Port Director (Port Director - daily port function including loading, unloading, administration) as well as the other ministry directors at the port (customs, immigration). It is assessed that when the DGs are in post, then the FPS will be brought firmly under command and will be restricted to security only. MOI/DBE has appointed a General as overall director for the SPOEs. The new General Officer position will oversee the operations of Port Directors at all 4 SPOEs. As of this time the line of authority from the SPOE General to DBE is not clearly defined to CF.

**DISCUSSION:** C3 Plans requested C3 ISF prepare a presentation on the facts, assumptions, constraints and risks used to forecast which IA units are available to deploy in support of Baghdad Security Operations. IGFC published OPORD 3 to cover the next rotation:

- A. Extend 4/1, 1/4/1, 2/4/1 and 3/1/3 (O/A 1 FEB 08)
- B. Extend 3/2/2 to the fourth phase (O/A 1 FEB 08) Beginning to hear threats of AWOL due to extension.

- F. 2/4/10 move to Besmaya delayed until 16 Nov with a likely RIP/TOA, with 1/4/10, now O/A 01-03 Dec 07.

Joint Capabilities Board review of JUONS had no significant results. JFCOM developed an in-lieu-of solution and engaged the global force management process. USJFCOM Sourcing Recommendation was deployment of MESF (3 x Armored RHIBs) to augment RIVRON by providing dam security to relieve Riverine assets to support dedicated Riverine requirements.

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Solution removed from SDOB by Navy. Naval planning team requested by MNF-I based on CONOP request from Chief of Naval operations; Navy identified members of the NECC.

Coalition partners contacted to determine capabilities/feasibility of support. All responses are negative. MND-SE terminated river patrols and prepositioned equipment to allow 7 day response if Iraqi capabilities are exceeded.

Based on MNC-I request to utilize Iraqi Fast Attack Boats, Iraqi Navy Commander signed MOU, boats were identified and inspected. US owned JP8 out board engines procured for the FAB and follow on Coalition watercraft. Six FAB are being repaired and configured by the 10<sup>th</sup> Trans Bn in Kuwait.

FRAGO published in 26Jun07 DTU, specifying commercial watercraft purchase option to MNDs utilizing OMA funds and internal assets to meet mission. DA LNO located 11 Coast Guard watercraft and got them laterally transferred to TPE for MND-N/MND-B with arrival 4-30 OCT. 10<sup>th</sup> Trans executes initial inspection and preparation. MND-B /MND-N directed delay in watercraft utilization based on RiP/TOA. Riverine way ahead submitted to JCS tank on 12OCT07, need CONOP. MND-C has submitted a JARB for three armored watercraft in accordance with 26 JUN07 DTU, delivery NLT 1 Jan 07.

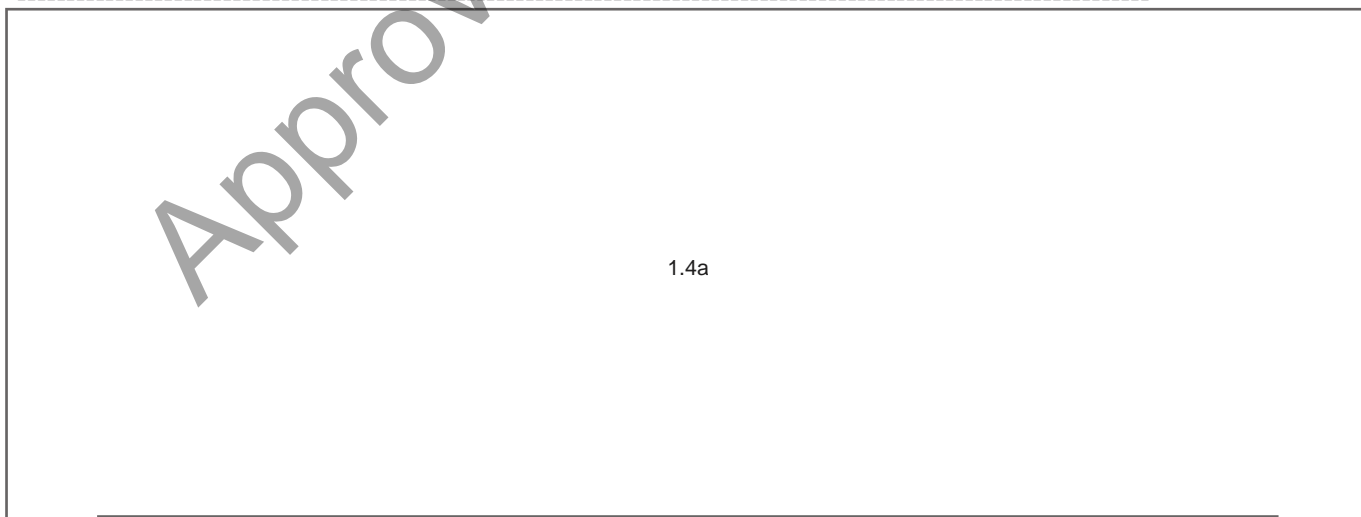
**Present:** Iraqi Navy Forces Commander has verbally agreed to extend FAB utilization to Oct 07, MOU is in his **office for signature**. FAB Engines are being installed in conjunction with safety related repairs with assistance from 1<sup>st</sup> TSC and 316th units and the Coast Guard at Kuwait Naval Base (KNB). Three of nine Coast Guard watercraft and three FAB with 10<sup>th</sup> Trans at KNB are operational. Coast Guard in theater training capability identified, training team linked up with 10<sup>th</sup> Trans for training plan able to train crews. Naval Planners completed CONOP recommendation. MNC-I requires a separate unit (1 x CID BN HHD) to conduct operations and criminalistic analysis for all Non-Improvised Explosive Device (IED) related evidence in the Iraq theater of operations. The CID BN HHD will serve as the Command and Control node for the future deployment of four Joint Expeditionary Forensic

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Facilities (JEFFs) to the ITO. JEFFs are a comprehensive forensic force multiplier for maneuver as well as support units that provide an immediate offensive capability by exploiting evidence of forensic value before, during and after any combat operations. The CID BN HHD provides forensic evidence collation, forensic examination and criminalistic analysis, command and control and linkage to MNC-I as well as reach back capability to the United States Criminal Investigations Laboratory (USACIL) and other CONUS labs and facilities. The CID BN HHD will liaise with appropriate interagency organizations to provide forensic support as needed. This capability will provide a critical resource and combat multiplier for deployed forces theater wide. Released to MNF-I on 4 NOV 07.

JIEDDO created the JIEDDO CIED Operations Integration Center in Virginia in 2006-7 to develop a broad variety of fused operations-intelligence products in support of USCENTCOM network attack operations. Commander MNC-I and Director, JIEDDO have conducted a proof of concept employment of a Corps Support Team (CST) and Division/MEF Support Teams (DST/MST). Through relatively small C2 and SATCOM deployment packages, the CST, DST/MST enable direct in-theater utilization of the extensive JIEDDO COIC capabilities. Commander MNC-I now requires these detachments, totaling 1,424 personnel (3 of which are already on a JIEDDO Field Team Iraq JMD), for recurring support of MNC-I and subordinate MND/MNF HQs for the duration of their deployments.

Fourteen (14) (but as of 24 OCT 07 fifteen) MNC-I finance detachments support 192,000 personnel (military and civilian) in Iraq, greater than twice the doctrinal number of 6,000 personnel each. MNC-I finance units also disburse over \$2,000,000,000 (\$2 billion) annually. Currently, three Financial Management COs provide internal control and technical oversight of MNC-I finance detachments in order to maintain accountability of public funds. A minimum of three Financial Management COs are required by doctrine to provide internal control/oversight. Redeployment of the 126 Financial Management CO (-) after 90 days will violate the doctrinal template and increase the potential for loss of public funds. Sourcing of the 126 Financial Management CO (-) at 67% of authorized strength (1.4a PAX) also jeopardizes their ability to perform their mission. This will restore the financial internal control/technical oversight capability that existed prior to FY 06-08 rotation. Two Department of Defense IG audits of internal controls of finance operations in South West Asia are currently ongoing or scheduled to begin in 2008. **CENTCOM released to Joint Staff as extension for current unit and as an enduring requirement 12 Nov 07.**

Since then, CCJ1 And CCJ4 have stated via e-mail that the JMD is not the correct method of sourcing this requirement and do not endorse the creation of a JMD to support this requirement. Discussed in detail with CENTCOM, JFCOM, and FORSCOM 21 Aug. Seeking short and long term solution. Short term solution is either a BOG extension (which CENTCOM vetted and believes is not feasible), or seeing volunteers and plugging with CONUS units. Long term solution is mod 2 to RFF 695 which will make the requirement enduring for the next ESC. 23 Aug: JFCOM AO is also researching the possibility of changing EXORD mod 7 to remove the JMD and make the requirement enduring by disconnecting the augmentation from single log C2 which will alleviate the need to an RFF mod. Formal message at CENTCOM and ARCENT FFA. JFCOM has stated via email that RFF 695 mod 2 will need to come forward to change the EXORD wording and to make the augmentation enduring and distinct from Single Log C2. CENTCOM is requesting that JS rescind the EXORD requiring the JMD. ESC is preparing to route their RFF. Short term solution is progressing. MNC-I CJ1 is working with 316 ESC G1 and coordinating with HQDA to have orders cut for current ESC augmentation volunteers. Coordination efforts are also in progress to use personnel on the in theater volunteer list (maintained by MNC-I CJ1) to fill nearly all of the remaining 1.4a positions left open. This effort will take approximately one month to complete and there is a risk of having Soldiers who have put their name on the volunteer list having changed their mind regarding staying in theater. 316 ESC has successfully filled 1.4a slots for the augmentation plug using the theater volunteer list and DA is providing the other 2 individuals. Will continue to press on the long-range sourcing solution. DA has refused to extend the 1.4a AGR Soldiers. Total now needed for short-term plug is 1.4a ARFOR and operational chain of commands apprised of situation. ESC will continue to identify volunteers until 15 Nov, and then ARFOR will need to provide remainder. Working point paper with C4 (b)(3), (b)(6) to route up chain of command for GO attention. **Currently, estimated number needed for plug is 1.4a ESC is tabulating data to pass up the chain of command.**

**21. TOPIC:** MNC-KU JMD (Update)

**DISCUSSION:** MNC-KU JMD was ordered in response to RFF 695M1 after first rotation was sourced via traditional sourcing. JMD is loaded in database by MNC-I CJ1, but cannot be activated by CENTCOM J1 due to the JMD process running through the GFMB, rather than the PSRB process. JMD cannot be active until JS directs which service(s) will fill this 1.4a pax JMD. Have again asked CENTCOM FM for support in resolving this sourcing issue. Working point paper with C4 (b)(3), (b)(6) to route up chain of command for GO attention.

**NEXT ACTION:** Request CENTCOM FM engage joint staff to change EXORD to indicate service(s) to fill.

**23. TOPIC:** Warfighter Function Rep (WFF) training proposal (Update)

**DISCUSSION:** IRT rapid theater turnover, rapid changes in the FM process and general inexperience in force management, joint AO level proposal is being generated to conduct training on FM processes and organizational support ICW CENTCOM FM shop. Working to identify agenda and location based on simple cost/benefit analysis. This conference will include MNF-I, MNC-I, MNSTC-I and TF [redacted] WFFs, and 18<sup>th</sup> ABN Corps primary Force Gen Reps. Proposal also includes making this training agenda theater-wide to be repeated annually at the beginning of the Force Requirements conference and exported to the WFFs of the incoming Corps prior to deployment. CENTCOM is coordinating training on 15 OCT at Scott AFB as part of the Force Flow Conference. Also considering a combined CENTCOM/MNC-I MTT for XVIII ABN if required to training XVIII ABN Corps WFFs if needed. XVIII ABN will send seven personnel to the training at Scott AFB. Primary FG AOs did not attend due to CPX at XVIII ABC.

**24. TOPIC:** Weapons Intelligence Teams Sourcing (New)

**DISCUSSION:** Currently USAF has been assigned to fill [redacted] 1.4a which is for the Weapons Intelligence (WI) CO (it includes the C2 element and 15 WI teams {WIT}). Thus far, only [redacted] 1.4a USAF personnel (i.e. intelligence analysts) for [redacted] 1.4a have been sourced to fill the requirement as of 11 Nov 07. Specifically, FY08 GFMAP Mod 2 sourced these [redacted] 1.4a personnel for this requirement. Currently, USAF has provided a non-concur to sourcing the other [redacted] 1.4a personnel required under [redacted] 1.4a. The reason provided for the USAF non-concur is that the service does not agree with the construct of the WI CO mission. This USAF non-concur has resulted in the recommendation by JFCOM to JS to provide a GO override of the USAF non-concur; however, as 11 Nov 07 MNC-I is unaware if this non-concur has been executed. Additionally, there is an issue with the USAF intention to fill a Military Police/Security Force skill set (AFSC 3P071) with Still Photographer (AFSC 3V072). Based upon the information pulled from the USAF website, there are [redacted] 1.4a Still Photographers under [redacted] 1.4a and another 3 under RFF 719 Mod 1 rotation completing training, vice Security Force personnel. Replacing Security Force personnel to fill the investigator position with a Still Photographer is an unacceptable in lieu of option because they are not investigators. Investigators are required because the WIT conducts cache and post blast investigations. With no indication that the appropriate Security Forces personnel have been identified, or received any of the required training, this too puts the WIT mission at risk. This in lieu of option was not staffed with MNF-I, MNC-I, or CJTF [redacted] 1.4a. There is no indication it was staffed outside of Air Force channels, as both CENTCOM and JFCOM staffs have non-concurred to Still Photographers to fill the investigator responsibilities. The combination of no official sourcing of the WI CO and teams coupled with the skill set issue must be resolved immediately to prevent a [redacted] 1.4c, 1.4g

**NEXT ACTION:** MNF-I pushing JS (second time). Recommend MNC-I GO level push as well to source the requirement officially with the Airman currently in the schoolhouse and ask for JS directed immediate re-sourcing of immediate replacements for [redacted] 1.4a photographers. Work with [redacted] 1.4a to coordinate a short term mitigation plan.
