The Task force became fully functional in Iraq in July 2007, headquartered at Camp Speicher in Tikrit – focuses on insurgents planting roadside bombs. “Army cobbled together small civilian aircraft...placed commanders at the level of brigade and below, an effort by the Army to be responsive to the needs of smaller units in direct contact with adversaries.” Initiative by Cody (who also did CEXC effort), outgoing
